The Dorcas Society will meet at the Emanuel Lutheran church next its wage rates are now about 10 per cent higher than a year ago, which increases will cost the Com-pany approximately \$650,000 in 1949. In its petition to the Commission the Company sought rate changes that would increase the bills of gas and electric customers about \$710,000 in 1949 at prevailing fuel charge rates. The changes, as modified and approved by the Commission, will result in an in-

crease of about \$540,000. Commencing January 15th, an electric fuel charge will be included in the bills of residential and small commercial customers, whereas heretofore it has been included only in the bills of certain large commercial and industrial users. The new gas rates are also effective January 15th.

In the past only a part of the increased fuel expense was passed on to customers by the application of the Company's fuel charge to gas and to large industrial and commercial customers only. With the extension of the application of the Company's fuel charge to all classes of service, which the mission has approved, any further increases in the Company's fuel cost will result in a proportionate increase in the bills of all custom-

The electric fuel charge which is somewhat lower in the case of residential than in the case of commercial and industrial service will amount to approximately 1-10 of a cent per kwhr. in January. 
