Heart Disease Deaths Grow

Far More Men Under 60 Die Than Women In Same Age Group
Hartford, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Far more men under 60 die from coronary heart disease in Connecticut than do women in the same age group, according to Dr. Miles B. Hines of the State Department of Health Bureau of Preventable Disease. Digging into the mortality records, Dr. Hines found that 11 of the 30-39 age group the ratio of male deaths to female deaths from the disease is 10 to 1; for the 40-49 age group, 8 to 1, and for the 50-59 age group the ratio was 3 to 1. In 1947, more than 3,843 Connecticut residents died of diseases of the coronary arteries and angina pectoris as compared with 889 from the same causes 10 years ago.
Increased prevalence over the years was attributed to such factors as unbalanced diets, which has, in turn, resulted in a greater number of older people and coronary heart disease is primarily a disease of older age groups.
It was found in the survey that proper education in sensible living coupled with early diagnosis and treatment should in time cause a decrease in the incidence of coronary heart disease, Dr. Hines concluded.

Increased prevalence over the years was attributed to such factors as unbalanced diets, which has, in turn, resulted in a greater number of older people and coronary heart disease is primarily a disease of older age groups.
It was found in the survey that proper education in sensible living coupled with early diagnosis and treatment should in time cause a decrease in the incidence of coronary heart disease, Dr. Hines concluded.
