



Vast Network of Companies Aid in Making

The Turbo-Wasp East Hartford, Jan. 6-Production of Pratt & Whitney Aircraft's new JT-6B Turbo-Wasp jet aircraft engine has brought into action an extensive supply network; involving scores of companies in all parts of the United States, it was announced today by W. P. Gwinn, vice president of United Aircraft Corporation and general manager of the Pratt & Whitney Aircraft division.

Raw materials and finished parts for the new 5,000-pound-thrust engine come from sixteen state, three of them in New England, Mr. Gwinn said. Companies in California, Wisconsin, Tennessee and Nebraska are among the

in California, Wisconsin, Tennessee and Nebraska are among the 55 suppliers of castings, bar stock, forgings, sheet metal and tubing and the 90 companies which furnish finished parts used directly in the Turbo-Wasp. Of some 900 different kinds of parts in the JT-6B, 500 are manufactured by Pratt & Whitney Aircraft and about 400 are manufactured by others.

Is Established Policy
The practice of subcontracting large parts of its production contracts has been the well established policy of both the corporation and its divisions for many years, Mr. Gwinn said. "Normally," he added, "we have about half of the production man-hours on all Pratt & Whitney engines supplied outside our own plant." It was this practice, he asserted, which assisted materially in expanding the production of the company's piston-type engines rapidly

pany's piston-type engines rapidly during World War II, when six automotive companies joined
Pratt & Whitney Aircraft to produce nearly half of all the aircraft
engine horsepower used by the
American armed forces.
"We think it speaks well for the

versatility of our team of sup-pliers," Mr. Gwinn said, "that 95 per cent of all the firms furnishing raw material and finished parts for the new Turbo-Wasp are com-panies which regularly supply parts and materials for our piston engines. The balance of the sup-pliers for jet engine production are new members of the team. In addition, there are about a hun-dred additional firms which stand ready to supply us with parts and materials for jet engines in the event there is a marked increase event there is a marked increase in military requirements."

40 Connecticut Firms

Fifty-eight of the 145 subcontractors on the JT-6B are located in Connecticut, Massachusetts and Rhode Island, 40 of them in Connecticut alone. Outside the New England area, Pennsylvania with 17 suppliers, New Jersey with 16, New York with 15 and Ohio with

New York with 15 and Ohio with 13, have the greatest participation in production activities for the Turbo-Wasp. Other states include Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Michigan and West Virginia. The count of suppliers for Turbo-Wasp production does not include hundreds of companies
