More Troubles Seen Looming for Bowles

Political Storm Warnings Flying as 74th Administration Today

Hartford, Jan. 6.—Political storm warnings were flying today as Chester Bowles began his administration as Connecticut's 74th Governor.

A partisan dispute in the politically-divided Legislature delayed his inauguration for more than four hours yesterday—and the reaction to his inaugural message indicated that more trouble lay ahead.

His message for peace. The war-time OPA administration, first elected in 1944, in its eight years, made a bid for peace in his first appearance before the Legislature.

A truce in party rivalries, he said, was essential to carry through what he called a "national good neighbor program on a state-wide scale."

But there were abundant signs that Republicans, whose representatives in the Legislature pending an election recount continued to lead, were not ready to compromise, were viewing the Bowles proposals with a cold and wary eye.

Chairs came from the Democratic side of the hall of the House, where the joint convention of the General Assembly was held, when Governor Bowles had finished. One exuberant Democrat "kicked" Bowles for presiding in 1947.

Bowles elected to head the broad outlines of a program covering most of the pledges on which he had campaigned, including state aid for education, increased benefits to labor and a bond financed state building program.

He did not mention the Democratic promise to repeal state sales tax, but said, however, that he would have "more detailed recommendations" to make in the next few days. These, aides said, would take the form of administration bills accompanied by statements.

"Far From Specific" Rep. George C. Conway, of Hamden, House Republican majority leader, complained that the inaugural message was "far from specific" and said he "looked in vain" for any recommendation of economy.

Instead, Conway asserted, "there were recommendations for more and expanded spending of money we do not have."

Senator Charles B. House, of Manchester, leader of the Republican minority in the upper chamber, dismissed the message as "the collection of innocuous platitudes."

Local Squires List Committees

Committees for the months of January, February and March were announced at the meeting of Brown-Lafayette-Straum circle, Connecticut Squires, last night by State Comptroller Raymond H. Thatcher. Also administered the oath of office was Treasurer Joseph A. Adorno, only Republican state officer to survive the election.

Each of the two chambers had completed their organization with the election of Senator Cornelius F. Mulvihill (D-Bridport) as president pro tem of the Senate, the state's third ranking officer, and Rep. John R. Thim (R-Hamden) as speaker of the House.

T. Emmet Clark, former House Democratic leader, was appointed Senate clerk, and James P. Gleason, former state senator and representative in Congress, was named assistant clerk. These posts in the house went to T. Ward Cleary and Robert Hall.

Following the inauguration, both chambers adjourned until 11:30 a. m. Tuesday, and many of the legislative and party differences forgotten for awhile, joined other guests in the day's activities at the colorful Foot Guard Inaugural ball.
