Will Britain Move In?
 The new and militarily luty state of Israel, flanked after a relatively easy routing of the forces of various Arab nations, is not showing a very large degree of self-control. Flirting with the idea of conquering all of Palestine, and thus confronting the United Nations and the Arab states with a military fact, it has apparently taken liberties with the Egyptian frontier.

These liberties, in turn, provided Britain with something of an excuse for bringing its own military power to the scene—as Britain has been itching to do for some weeks past. And when British planes appeared over one of the Egyptian-Israeli battlefields, whether in Palestine or in Egypt is yet to be fully determined, that was, in a sense, Britain looking for a little trouble. The Israeli forces then proceeded to do Britain a diplomatic favor by shooting down five of the planes.

Britain is now using that incident as the justification for increasing concentration and display of its own military strength and around its own sphere of influence in the Arab states.

The question now is whether Britain will be content with mere manifestation of military strength, designed to keep the rash armies of Israel from crossing Arab borders again, or whether Britain will go to the extreme policy of pushing forward into the war itself.

If the British do push forward into the war, they will have a well understood objective, British policy, from the moment it reconciled itself to the loss of its military position in Palestine, has been planning the establishment of a new military position in the Negev, that southern area of Palestine for which the Israeli armies have been battling. It is Britain's plan to have this territory, or at least part of it, go to its puppet Arab state of Trans-Jordan which, in turn, would accommodate British military purposes.

Britain has been successful enough, diplomatically, in this aim. The new partition recommendation of the late Count Bernadotte took the Negev away from Israel. And various United Nations orders have directed the Israeli to keep out of the Negev. But these British diplomatic victories have been cancelled out by the Israeli armies, which have taken the Negev, and have no intention of giving it up. Now the prime danger is that Britain will try to reconquer the Negev for her friends the Arabs, who, in turn, will permit it to become a new British military base.

That is the specific danger. A larger and more general world danger is also illustrated in the present Palestine situation.

It is the United Nations which has been trying to make peace in Palestine. But now, when a police force is finally being brought to bear on the Palestine situation, it is not a United Nations police force, but the force of an empire which has unilateral power politics interests of its own.

Similarly in Indonesia, it has been the United Nations which has been trying to direct peace. But when force arrives on the scene, it is not the police force of the United Nations, but the force of one of the contestants in the controversy. The United Nations ponders and issues edicts, but it is the British military which threatens to become the final arbiter in Palestine. The United Nations recommends, but it is the Dutch army which has appointed itself the arbiter in Indonesia.

If the United Nations is to survive and mean anything, it must have its own international police force, capable of enforcing its own mediation edicts.

Change Or No Change?
 Why have the nation's headlines, reflecting the official statements of President Truman, seemed so loudly that the shift from General Marshall to Dean Acheson in the State Department means a "cold war" policy, while every bit of intelligent analysis and unofficial comment has been speculating on the amount of change forthcoming, and generally concluding that there will be change?

Why are we told, on one page, that the news is thus and so, and, on another, that it is something almost the opposite?

The answer lies in the rigorous necessities of politics and diplomacy. Let us assume that President Truman does himself intend to see that a gradual change in American foreign policy is accomplished over the next two months—a change which will lead to the making of an honorable peace. That, we think, is a reasonable assumption. The announcement itself should have accompanied it with a frank avowal of his intention to produce a change in the conduct of our foreign policy. This, as we shall see, would have been almost impossible for him to do. But let us calculate what would happen if he did so.

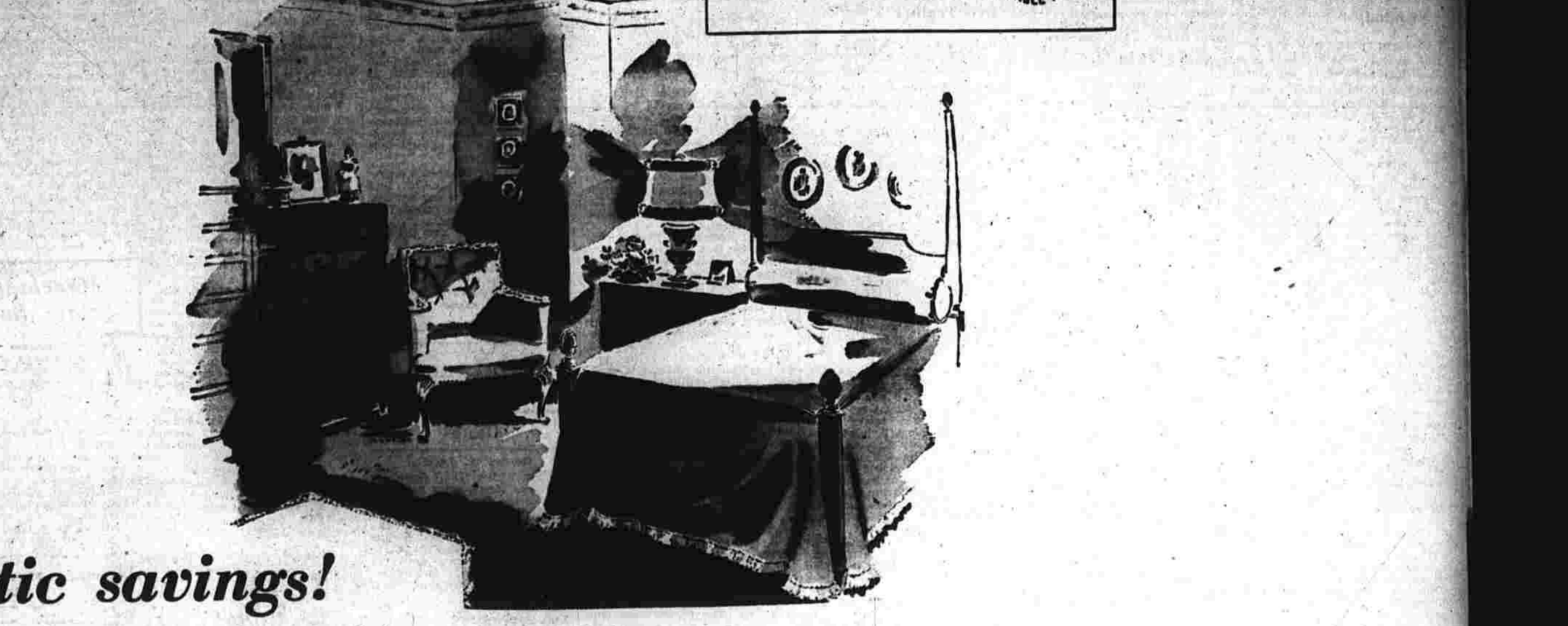
