

Says Britain Has No Plan to Take Hand in Warfare

Bevin Asserts Nation Has 'No Obligations Or Intentions to Engage in Any Offensive or Aggressive Action in Middle East'

London, Jan. 18.—(AP)—Foreign Secretary Bevin said today Britain has "no obligations or intentions to engage in any offensive or aggressive action" in the Middle East war over Palestine. With this assurance, he asked the House of Commons not to press at this time for a full scale discussion of the Labor government's Middle East policy.

Might Endanger Peace Talks

He said a Palestine debate now might endanger the success of the Jewish-Egyptian peace talks on Rhodes.

Bevin announced that Britain now is ready to release Jewish refugees of military age interested on the island of Cyprus.

"We have been discussing the position of these immigrants with the parties concerned," he said. "The much more favorable situation that has now arisen has permitted us to send a message to the acting mediator announcing that we are prepared to allow these men to leave as soon as the Jews provide transport for them."

He proposed this amendment by stating that fighting in Palestine has ceased "on all fronts."

Winston Churchill, wartime prime minister who has urged the government recognize the new Jewish state, described the plan to release the refugees as "not fitting in very well with the drastic military action" Bevin "has taken in other directions."

It is not reinforcing both sides at once? Churchill asked.

This was an apparent reference to the dispatch of British troops to Agria, Red sea port in southern Palestine.

Herbert Morrison, leader of the House, pointed the debate on a debate on the Middle East policy next week.

Death Offers Police Puzzle

Heir of New York Banking Family Found Beside His Wrecked Jeep

Tallahassee, Fla., Jan. 18.—(AP)—A bundle of evidence in the puzzling, unsolved slaying of wealthy Greenville Baker was found beside his wrecked jeep today, Sheriff Frank Stantimir said he has asked the FBI to run tests on the death gun. He also is sending to Washington paraffin casts of the hands of three of Baker's companions to learn whether any of them had fired a gun recently.

Tallahassee, Fla., Jan. 18.—(AP)—The death of wealthy Greenville Baker, who was found beside his wrecked jeep with a pistol wound in his head, presented a puzzle to police today.

A coroner's jury, after four hours of testimony from witnesses last night, found only that the 37-year-old heir of a New York banking family was killed by a pistol "held by a party or parties unknown."

A divorced tavern waitress who was with Baker when the jeep was wrecked could give no explanation for the bullet wound.

No One Being Held

Sheriff Frank Stantimir offered no theories, and no one was being held in connection with the case.

The young millionaire's jeep was about 3,200 ft. m. (e. s. w.) Monday on one of his many winding trails in his mother's "Berkshire plantation," where the Duke and Duchess of Windsor were entertaining for years ago.

The waitress, Mrs. Thelma Griffin, said she never had met Baker before Sunday night. She testified that Baker fired the pistol shot in an effort to attract the attention of a car of companions just before he lost control of the jeep.

Thrown Out and Dazed

The car straddled an embankment and she was thrown out and dazed, the young divorcee testified. She also recovered consciousness and saw Baker in the middle of the road, and heard him groan.

She ran to the highway, met the other car which was waiting for her, and reported the accident.

They returned to the scene, she said, and Baker died a few minutes later without regaining consciousness.

Although Mrs. Griffin said she heard only the single shot Baker fired while he was driving the jeep

Seek Missing British Plane

Air and Sea Rescue Forces Mobilized Over South Atlantic Today

Hamilton, Bermuda, Jan. 18.—(AP)—Air and sea rescue forces were mobilized over the South Atlantic today to search for a missing British airliner with 20 persons aboard.

The British South American Airways liner "Aster" disappeared while on the 1,000-mile flight from Bermuda to Kingston, Jamaica, yesterday. It was due at Kingston at 1:07 p. m. (e. s. t.) yesterday and was last heard from at 4:37 a. m. The flight normally takes five and a half hours. Presumably the plane long since was out of gas.

The airline said in London that all but three of the passengers were British.

U. S. Coast Guard Air-Sea rescue headquarters at Miami Tuesday reported the plane missing. It was normally scheduled for an early morning search.

Chiles and Pines Aboard

The Coast Guard in New York sent rescue planes from Staten Island, Mass., Brooklyn, N. Y., Elizabeth City, N. C., and other Florida cities to search for the plane. At Nassau, the Bahamas, were to join the hunt at the first light of day, and ships and planes throughout the area were alerted.

The coast-guard salvage tug Foundation Lillian, which figured in the rescue of the British ship "Lancaster" last year, was ordered by the British Admiralty to search the area 150 miles south of Bermuda.

United States destroyers in port at Jamaica were ordered to search north of Cuba.

One rescue plane from Findley held Bermuda, searched the area late yesterday without finding a trace of the plane.

Defense Attorneys Argue Foster's Presence 'Absolutely Indispensable' to Their Case

Foreign Diplomats Expected to Be Told of Government Disparal

New York, Jan. 18.—(AP)—Federal Judge Harold R. Medina ruled today the trial of 11 top-ranking Communist officials should proceed without William Z. Foster, the national head of their party, who is ill.

Foster, suffering from a heart ailment, is one of 12 party leaders indicted on charges of working for the foreign overthrow of the government.

Oppose Plea Vigorously

Defense attorneys vigorously opposed the government's plea to continue with the trial in Foster's absence. They argued he was "absolutely indispensable" to presentation of their case.

However, U. S. Attorney John F. X. McGobey moved that a severance be granted so that the trial of the others go ahead.

Judge Medina, after listening to lengthy defense arguments by several attorneys, said:

"I grant the government's motion in both respects."

However, he announced immediately afterwards he would be willing to hear a further defense motion for postponement of the trial to a later date.

Earlier, Judge Medina had overruled defense objections to police detailed around the U. S. courthouse.

Meat Prices Drop Shown

General Wholesale Reduction of 20 Per Cent Since September

Chicago, Jan. 18.—(AP)—The general wholesale price of all meat has dropped 20 per cent from the mid-September peak, says the American Meat Institute.

Retail prices, the institute said, also "show some sharp average declines." It said pork chops have fallen an average of 25 per cent from the September prices; round steak 23 per cent; corned beef 22 per cent; leg of lamb 17 per cent; and lamb chops and hamburger 13 per cent.

The retail figures were supplied by the A.M.I. by chain and other retail stores in the Chicago market.

Lead Decline Greatest

Lead has shown the greatest price decline of any meat product in the past year, the institute said.

It now is selling approximately 25 per cent under a year ago.

The institute said the decline in wholesale meat prices is considerably greater than the reduction in all food prices which dropped 15 per cent from the high points reached in the latter part of July.

The wholesale figures are based on government and trade quotations in Chicago, New York and San Francisco. The institute, which represents the packing industry, said the figures "represent averages covering all meats of all kinds as well as representative grades and weights."

Four Perish During Blaze

Two Others of Family Seriously Burned in Windber, Pa., Today

Windber, Pa., Jan. 18.—(AP)—Four members of a family of seven perished today in the flames of a fire that started in the dining room of their one-room home, one and one-half miles west of Windber, Pa., in Somerset county. Two others were seriously burned.

Only one of the family escaped injury—an 18-month-old baby boy.

The victim Snyder, 40, coal miner; and a daughter, Gertrude, 12, were taken to a Windber hospital. The girl's condition was reported as critical and the father's as fair.

Dead were the mother, Mrs. Anna Rose Snyder, 28, and her daughter, Nancy Janet, 5, Elizabeth June, 7, and Charlotte, 9.

The charred bodies of Mrs. Snyder and Nancy and Elizabeth were found on the floor of the home, Charlotte died of burns in the Windber hospital.

The baby, John, suffered no injuries.

College Senior Shot to Death

Hotel Guest Who Became Angry at Salutation Form Is Held

St. Louis, Jan. 18.—(AP)—John P. X. Rea, a St. Louis university senior, was shot and killed today in a hotel corridor at the end of a champagne party and Police Capt. William Plitner said a hotel guest who became angry when Rea addressed him with "Hi Stupid" was the killer.

Plitner said the man, Carlo DiLiberto, 43, is booked suspected of homicide and will be given paraffin tests for powder marks on his hands. Plitner said DiLiberto did not know Rea and has denied the shooting.

Plitner gave this account of the mysterious events preceding the slaying of Rea's body:

DiLiberto was providing champagne for several room guests and asked a woman in the party to invite some friends. The woman called a taxi to a nearby tavern and during the conversation DiLiberto took the telephone and was heard to say "You can't call me Stupid and get by with it. Come over here and I'll show you who's Stupid." The woman said Rea always greeted her with "Hi Stupid."

DiLiberto then left the room with a gun taken from another woman guest's purse and the party later heard shots in the corridor. They found Rea's body a few doors down the hall.

DiLiberto was standing beside the taxi when it arrived and the party later arrived and they found the woman's gun on the sixth floor, two floors below DiLiberto's room.

Rea's parents live in the Bronx, New York.

Police said DiLiberto has been identified as the man who directed the slaying of the heavy fall of snow in the southeastern United States and most of the eastern states. A cooler weather was forecast for southern California but no severe winter weather was expected.

Some Object To Truman's Changes Plea

Johnson Will Be Surprised If President Allowed to Shake Up Independent Agencies

Washington, Jan. 18.—(AP)—Some objections arose on Capitol Hill today to President Truman's plea for authority to reshuffle government bureaus.

Chairman Edwin C. Johnson (D-Colo.) of the Senate Commerce committee told a reporter he will be surprised if Mr. Truman gets permission to shake up such agencies as the Interstate Commerce commission, which now operates independently of any cabinet department.

The president urged specifically in a special message to Congress yesterday that "no agency or function of the executive branch be exempted from his proposed right to reorganize Washington, except the court system and Congress."

Assembly to Receive Three Bowles' Plans; Carry Out Proposals

New Rent Control Legislation, Measure to Make Evictions More Difficult and Creation of Non-Partisan Commission to Modernize Governmental Structure Proposed

State Capitol, Hartford, Jan. 18.—(AP)—Hartford bills carrying out three of Governor Bowles' major inaugural proposals were drafted today for presentation to the General Assembly.

The measures proposed: new rent control legislation to replace a 1947 act which the governor termed a "monstrosity" in his inaugural message; legislation to make evictions more difficult; and creation of a non-partisan commission to modernize the governmental structure.

One of the jobs the organization commission in his inaugural message, is to make a reclassification study of our state wage scales.

In a special message of the General Assembly a week ago today, the governor recommended anti-eviction legislation whereby the burden of establishing the right to regain possession of dwelling premises would be definitely placed on the landlord.

He also said there should be "criminal penalties for the punishment of property owners who attempt by fraud or otherwise to circumvent the law in order to evade a tenant."

The rent control bill proposed standby legislation to become effective should federal controls be removed.

Invited to Conference

The three messages were handed to Senator Alfred F. Wechsler, Democratic leader, as the Democratic chief executive legislative leaders for the first bi-partisan conference since assuming office.

The governor's office said similar bi-partisan conferences would be held during the year. They would serve useful purposes, the General Assembly in politically divided, with Republicans in control of the House and Democrats of the Senate.




