10 Coast Guards Killed as Result of Crash in Fog

At Least 19 Injured As Cutter and Tanker In Fiery Collision Off Coast of New Jersey; Ammunition Store Threatened

New York, Jan. 18.—(AP)—Ten Coast Guardsmen were killed and at least 19 injured today in the fiery crash of a Coast Guard cutter and a tanker in thick fog off the New Jersey coast. Many of their shipmates courageously stayed aboard the flaring cutter to assist in the rescue and control the fire that threatened the ship's ammunition stores. Seventy-eight uninjured survivors of the crash were taken aboard another vessel.

The collision occurred about 60 miles southeast of Barnegat light beach. The 66-foot tanker Guilford, which collided with the Eastwind, reported she was proceeding to New York under her own power with in injured crew of 42. Her bow was damaged. The freighter Republic of Columbia came alongside the Eastwind and crewmen went aboard to help the cutter's crew fight the flames, the Coast Guard reported. The collision occurred about 10:30 a. m. (e.s.t.) At 11:10 a. m. (e.s.t.) the shipper of the Republic reported the cutter was under control. The U. S. S. School Plans Make Progress

Joint Efforts of Local Groups Are Now Having Their Effect

The joint efforts of the School Building Committee and the Board of Education during the past month have resulted in rapid progress being made toward the acceptance of final plans for two new school buildings in Manchester.

Final plans for the Princeton street school have already been approved and will be ready for bids by March 1. With the construction begun by the first of April six rooms should be ready for occupancy by early fall with the remainder of the building finished before the end of the year.

Plans are being drawn up by the Superintendent of Schools, Arthur H. Billing, to provide for the relocation of pupils in the area affected by the two schools so that the shift may be made as smoothly and as quickly as possible once the schools are open for use.

These plans too, should be ready for bids by March 1, with construction to start April 1, and be finished by the end of 1949.

The Otis street school will contain 18 classrooms, two music and art rooms, a library, a gymnasium, shop and domestic science rooms are no longer to be included in the elementary schools since the school system is to be changed to a high school system as soon as possible.

Both the Board of Education and the School Building Committee have considered the plan for the two buildings very thoroughly with a view to providing the extra classrooms as desperately needed as expeditiously and as economically as possible.

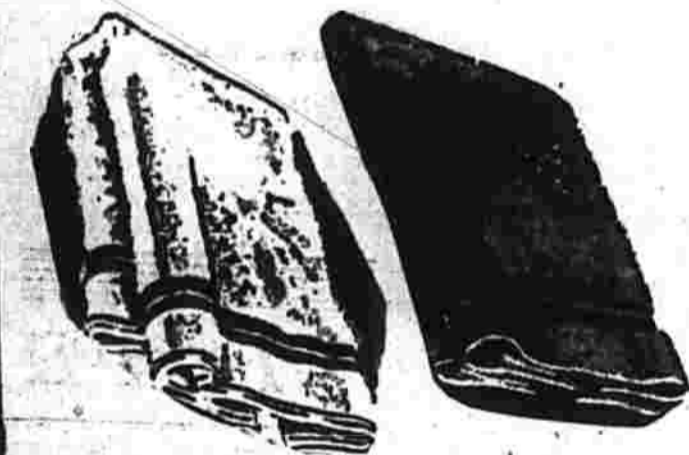

Scott Sees Himself As Four-Year Man

Republican Party Will Be Middle-of-Road If Chairman Has Anything to Say About It

Washington, Jan. 18—(AP)—The 48-year-old chairman of the Republican party if National Chairman Hugh D. Scott has anything to say about it.

And if any Republican thinks Scott is going to roll over, play dead and take his orders from any of the big bank roll boys or possible presidential candidates, Scott says he has another think coming.

To Have Voice in Policy
The 48-year-old chairman made it plain to me he looks upon himself as a four-year man, intends to have a voice in forming Republican policy and is ready for any kind of scrap that comes his way.

Some members of the Republican National Committee have been taking pot shots at Scott, installed hurriedly at the C. O. P. National convention in June, he will go into a session of the committee in Omaha Jan. 25 and 26 still a stranger to about half of its members.

But he isn't worried about the center efforts by some of those who are disgruntled with the way the election turned out.

Scott played a third or fourth fiddle in the campaign band, which was directed by Gov. Thomas E. Dewey's personal friend, Herbert Brownell, Jr.

Determined to Take Baton
Now Scott is determined to take over the baton and—with some concessions to congressional leaders—he seems in a fair way to get the nod.

What he has in mind, Scott said, is to weld together a party that has its conservatives and its liberals but is made up mostly of the middle-of-the-road folk he thinks can cast a lot of votes if they are stirred up.

"In a middle of the road, myself," he said, "I think my record is good in Congress, and I'm willing to stand on it."

Like a lot of his Republican colleagues in the House, Scott voted for the Taft-Hartley act, which was assailed so bitterly by President Truman during the campaign.

Scott picked up some ideas about scrapping during the war. He went into Japan on the first day of occupation as a lieutenant commander, serving for a short time under Harold E. Stassen, then a commander.

Stassen is one of Scott's constituents, and they see each other frequently. But that doesn't mean, the chairman said, that he's a supporter of Stassen, who is looked upon as a likely candidate for the C. O. P. presidential nomination in 1948.

"I know all the other potential candidates, and I'm friendly with them, too," he said.

Accepted At Face Value
Although he owes his job to Dewey, Scott said he is accepting at face value the New York governor's statement that he will never be a presidential candidate again.

Scott greets with a smart Democratic charge that he was "hand-picked" as chairman by State Senator Joseph Grundy, a Pennsylvania Republican power.

"I admire and respect Senator Grundy," Scott said. "I think

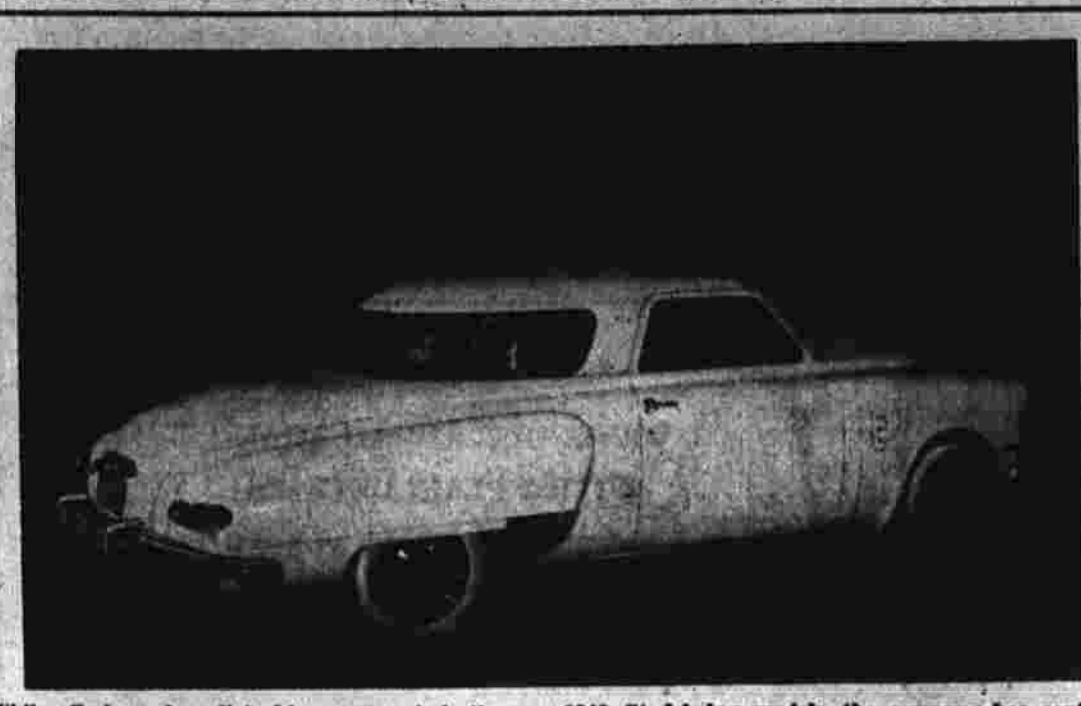

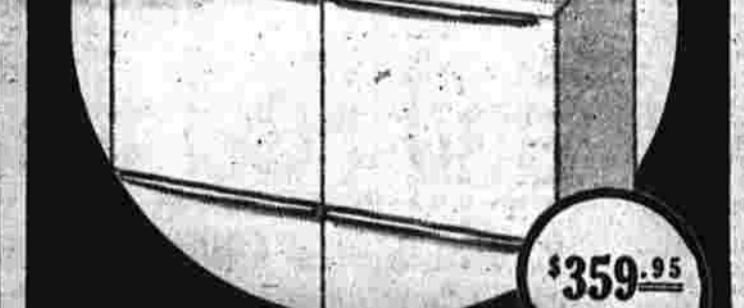

Well Styled Vernon School Committee Makes Public Its Report

The Vernon School Building Committee is presenting this as a report in a series of articles on the school building program in the Town of Vernon. This Building Committee was appointed at a Town Meeting held June 24th, 1948. It has held regular meetings every two weeks with sub-committees working in between. This article will attempt to show the conditions of our present facilities and the recommendations of the committee in the elementary school.

Following is the report:

The school building committee has prepared this report to explain to the public the reasons why it is recommending that the Town build two new schools, one for the Northeast section and one for the Rural Area in the South End of the town. Each school is to contain eight grades and kindergarten with auxiliary rooms. Cost and plans will be explained in detail further on in the report.

"Vernon, like many towns, recognized years ago that some of its school buildings were old, worn, and should be replaced. A Town Meeting in 1938 voted for a school in the South End which would place the five and two room buildings only two miles, one at Vernon Depot and one at Talcottville. The Northeast section of the town long ago wanted to improve their factor to bear in mind, however, is that the figures show that the town is still here and from every indication, the town is growing. The number of years in the grade school is older and more antiquated and many more children are growing and we must do something about it.

"Vernon's town, has not done so well in building of elementary schools since Maple Hill was built in 1922-23. The East Primary school has eight grades and a very old and dilapidated playground facilities. Some attempts have been made to make it safe but structurally its floor, walls and stairs are not suitable for school purposes due to the fact, the whole interior needs extensive repairs and the building still has an old, unattractive building on an inadequate site. Northeast School, 117 years old, is a wooden structure which has been used for six grades. It is absolutely pure silk.
