Bill Tentatively Drafted for Presentation to General Assembly

Hartford, Jan. 21.—(AP)—A bill which would virtually double Connecticut's state aid for education has been tentatively drafted by the state Department of Education for presentation to the General Assembly. It was disclosed today.

Calling for a new appropriation of \$21,000,000 for the next two-year period, it is one of three money bills totaling nearly \$60,000,000 on the department's drafting board, and would raise the state's contribution for "current expenses" to the highest level in history.

Plan Training Of Teachers

Emergency Programs to be Conducted by Four State Colleges

Hartford, Jan. 21.—(AP)—Emergency training programs for elementary school teachers will be conducted by the four state Teachers colleges.

The emergency courses are designed to ease an acute shortage of elementary school teachers. A minimum of basic instruction and practice teaching will be given to qualify candidates for teaching assignments.

The state Department of Education, announcing the program yesterday, said these persons completing the courses successfully will be given temporary teaching certificates, with the understanding that they will receive regular licenses if they make teaching careers and qualify through in-service courses.

Will Need 800 Teachers: The department estimated that 800 new elementary school teachers will be needed next fall, with only 250 of this number coming from graduates of the four state Teachers colleges.

School Building Program First One Taken as a Town

If the citizens of Manchester support the proposed bond issue for local schools it will be the first time that the town has spent any money on a school building program. Before the consolidation of the school districts, each district took care of its own building needs.

When Manchester was named Orford Parish, however, it did not support its own school building program. About 1745, when this town was still part of East Hartford, a school was built on what is now West Center street.

Six years later, in 1751, it was decided to establish five school districts. These districts were located in the sections known as the Bunce District, Buckland, Manchester Green, Keesey street, and the Center. In 1851, the West Center street school was replaced with a new building on the same site.

Later a school was built in the vicinity of the home of Alexander Keesey on the street now bearing his name. This building was used until about 1848 when it was sold to Enos and Eliza Treat. Its site may be judged from a pair of draft lines.

The school now serves as a garage for the family of Bert McConville on Keesey street. It is called on the original site.

In 1886, part of the town of East Windsor, known as Long Hill, and part of the town of East Hartford were taken into the Buckland School District. Property belonging to Harlow M. Fowler was added to the North West district in 1828.

What is now Manchester Green was more commonly known as Orford Parish. The authorization for the school society of Orford established by authority of the General Assembly of 1706 undoubtedly referred to this section. The early records of the Green school district, in 1816, the erection of a brick school there was noted.

The first "South" school was built, it is believed, about 1770 and was a one-room building, occupying the site. Irons Brown was for many years the teacher.

Industry Told To Stay Alert

Olda Opposes Entry By Government Into Private Business

Hartford, Jan. 21.—Irving S. Olda urges industry to be on the alert "for the possible firing of an opening gun in a long range program for the entry by government into what has heretofore been regarded as private business.

The chairman of the board of the United States Steel Corporation, speaking at a dinner of the Manufacturers Association of Hartford County last night, referred to President Truman's recent State of the Union message which, he said, had been interpreted as a possible threat of the government entering the steel business.

Mr. Truman urged Congress to approve a study of the nation's remaining capacity with authority for Federal construction of facilities. Present capacity is found to be inadequate and private industry refuses to expand sufficiently.

Record High Production

Olda contended that the steel industry shipped 65,000,000 tons of finished steel products in 1948. That, he said, "was a record high production for any year, wartime or peacetime, in the history of the American steel industry."

He said also that the industry had added some 15,000,000 tons of capacity in the past ten years, and another two million tons scheduled for completion in 1949.

Olda said that American business "primary task" is to tell the people about the facts of business and "the great achievements and virtues of our American system."

"In my judgment," he said, "this is the effective way to insure that those who would establish a new order of things in the United States will forever remain in the minority."

Vets Affairs Agency Urged

New State Department To Coordinate Activities To Be Proposed

Hartford, Jan. 21.—A state "department of veterans affairs" is proposed in a bill soon to be introduced in the General Assembly.

The measure, sponsored by the Connecticut State Veterans forum, an organization of state commanders of 18 different organizations, would create the new department to coordinate all veterans activities now carried on by the state.

Would Replace Commission

It would replace the present Veterans Advisory commission, which

under present law will go out of existence on July 1. A new veterans affairs commission of nine members would supervise the new department, which would be headed by a salaried director and have a budget of about \$100,000 annually.

The commission would be composed of three delegates from the American Legion, two from the Veterans of Foreign Wars, one from the Disabled American Veterans and three from all other veterans organizations.

Under the bill, the department's activities would be financed from proceeds of the state cigarette tax.

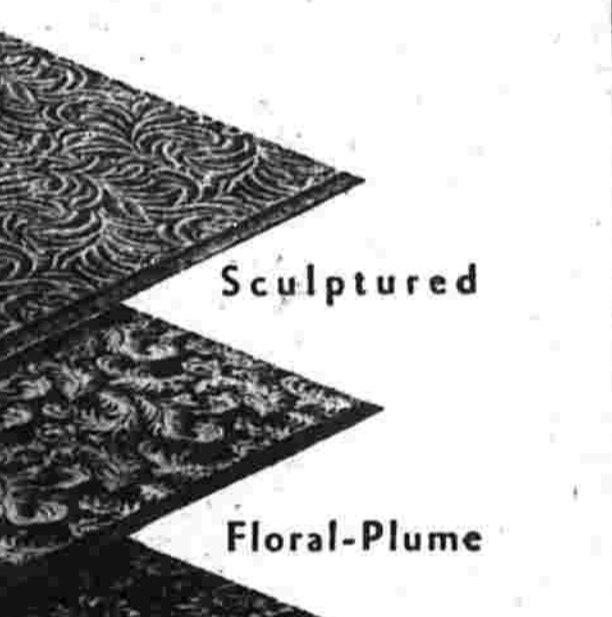
