Tells How to Aid
Russia's People

Father George, the priest who has collaborated with Greta Palmer in the writing of "God's Underground" uses a question and answer method in order that he may be understood by the Russian people. "Peoples like individualism return to the faith by three methods: miracles, punishment, and prayer." Father George maintains that "all three have assumed a part in the still unexplained drama of which I write. All three continue: the miracles are in God's hands, the punishments are in the Russian authorities. But the prayers are our affair. I beg of you, whoever you may be... to join in the four word aspiration whose repetition will one day make this people free: 'Savior of the World, save Russia!'"

It was Greta Palmer, the well-known magazine writer and lecturer, who "discovered" Father George, the man who advocates the use of the word "underground" for the Russian people. On her trip to Eastern Europe where she has been for the past several months, she cancelled her original plan to visit the Vatican and instead visited him to dictate his eyewitness account of the situation in Russia to her. "God's Underground" is a book of French steno-graphers. It was from this account that Greta Palmer wrote the amazing book, "God's Underground."

Hartford, Feb. 2—(AP)—Governor Bowers today was free to be an intensive study of Connecticut's housing situation, something he said, he would start immediately.

Yesterday he asked the Legislature for a record of \$25,000,000 back set for the biennium beginning July 1, and urged that the 1950 bond issue be approved to provide financing for a backlog of desperately needed state buildings and equipment. The budget now goes to the Appropriations committee.

Saying he saw no need for new taxes, Bowers urged that the methods of taxation be changed with a state personal income tax.

His budget requests also included one of \$200,000 for rent subsidies, plus \$410,000 to establish a state housing department. But he did not detail this phase of his request to spend \$37,200,000 more during the coming two years than was appropriated for the present biennium.



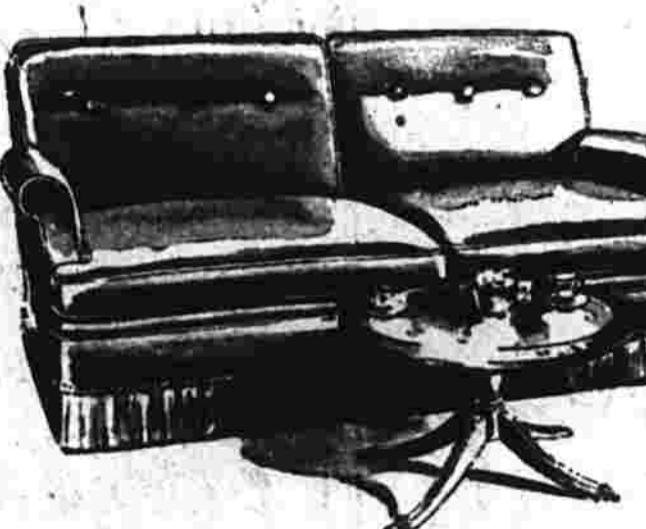

upon us," House said. "The enrollment wave has already reached the third grade. Rooms designed for a capacity of 30 now hold 40. Last year many were refused admission because of overcrowding."

There now are three double sessions in the Hollister school house, and the prospect for this school alone is that with an already overcrowded total of 480 pupils, the school must accommodate 711 next year.

We have exhausted all remedial measures insofar as space is concerned," House said. "It is pointed out that the Robertson school built for 180 will have to take in 327 pupils next year; the Green school will take 146 instead of its capacity 240; Lincoln school will take 588 in rooms for only 420 and Washington school will be overcrowded by 160 pupils.

"This condition, House said, should be corrected by the construction of new classrooms.

The locations of the proposed new schools, he said, have been determined after thorough survey and planning which will shortly give the town facilities for a junior high school system. He called attention to the MIT survey conducted here, under which it is recommended that a new high school be built within the coming ten years, and that the Hollister school and the present high school be devoted to the junior high program.

Mr. Silverstein, next called on, said that his remarks would be summed up in answer to the questions who build? Where build? When build? and What build?

"These questions cannot await answer longer," Silverstein said. "We need the schools yesterday if we are to avoid the worst of the critical stage of the need."

He outlined the program under which it is hoped that a portion of the Princeton street school building is to be occupied this fall, and the other facilities, such as the Broad street school and the alterations at Hollister, must be planned now so that they will become available as needed. This will result in no great strain on the town Silverstein said. It is furthermore an investment in the future and in the town's greatest asset—its future citizens.

"Knowledge is power," Silverstein said. "It is the power to achieve peace, the power to live decently and the power to give our children a chance to make out a little better life than we have done."

Expansive Alternatives

In his remarks, General Manager Waddell pointed out that the Princeton and Broad street schools will be almost identical in size; that the Olcott street school will be larger, but that all will embody the same type of construction and the same furnishing.

Understanding to answer questions raised so far about the schools, Waddell said that the Olcott street school and \$500,000 for plans for the new Broad street school and for the making of alterations and additions at the Hollister street school.

Waddell recommended that the school's controllable be an outright appropriation which would be added to the budget, and that the cost be covered by the bond issue. He also stated that the \$300,000 cost of planning the two proposed schools, now charged against the town's capital reserve fund, be transferred so that it may be paid out of the bond issue.

He said that this fund had been apportioned in his estimate between the two schools already.

Town's Debt Position

The general manager proceeded to sum up the town's debt position. He noted the following: The town owes still the 3 1/2 per cent Franklin, High and Educational Square bonds maturing May 1, 1951 at \$200,000 repayment annually, to be completed May 1, 1951.

The town owes \$12,000 on a bond issue of November 1, 1950, as a result of taking of the debt of the High School and Utilities District when school districts were consolidated.

The Broad street school bond issue of April, 1932 will pay off \$1,000 paid off November 1, 1949.

The \$175,000 veterans' housing bonds at 1 1/2 per cent is being paid off from interest on \$20,000 annually with final payment May 1, 1955.

The total amount to some \$250,000 in bonds outstanding at present.

Water Department Bonds

This, Waddell pointed out, is apart from the bonds of the water department bought from Cheney Brothers in 1933 with no capital investment. The town owes \$200,000 bond issue due in 1954, and water department bonds of \$200,000, built up in interest from water department income and not drawn from town tax incomes.

In addition, the water department should \$650,000 payable by September 1, 1973, at 3 1/2 per cent.

To Continue Reserve Fund

General Manager Waddell said that it would be his recommendation, even if it means a larger tax rate. By continuing to build up the reserve fund, Waddell said, it will be possible to have an amount of \$1,000,000 in the proposed new high school, this structure is built.
