World Gets Notice Red Move Will Not Be Let Hurt Unity

Real Significance Seen In Acheson's Rejection of Stalin's Latest Declaration of Willingness to Hold Meeting With Truman

Washington, Feb. 3.—(AP)—The United States served notice on the world today that it will allow no Russian "peace maneuver" to disrupt the growing unity of the non-Communist western powers.

The question won't be decided in aid, on "whether other nations want us to do or not to do." He added Norway will have to make "further investigations" before making up its mind on whether it wants an invitation to join in discussion of a proposed Atlantic alliance of western powers.

Turning thumbs down on Stalin's latest peace move, the United States announced today that it will not accept the Russian offer to meet Mr. Truman for the purpose of considering a "Soviet-American pact of peace."

Stalin's offer, which he said was "a step toward the realization of the American charge that the present state of the world is due to Russia's 'obstruction' in the United Nations and in other international forums where the great problems of the world are supposed to be solved."

Analysis of Stalin's Sunday declaration point by point, Acheson asserted the United States would not ally itself with the world's peace hopes. At one point he added: "No man of conscience would tamper with those hopes or use the raising or lowering of them as a pawn in any maneuver."

Further, he made it clear that in his opinion it would be unwise for the United States to travel "half way around the world" for the fourth time to honor Stalin and make a pledge of peace when both Russia and the United States are already pledged by the United Nations not to resort to war.

New Ordinance Sets Up Local Building Committee

The Board of Directors, after adopting an ordinance setting up a Building Committee for the Town of Manchester, the group presently informally set up to bring in plans for new elementary schools, headed by Saul M. Silverstein, has been confirmed as the Committee and its functions defined.

Resolved: That, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter III, Section 1, 8 and 9, of the Town Charter, and subject to the terms thereof, there be and is hereby enacted and adopted the following ordinance providing for a Building Committee for the Town of Manchester:

Section 1. For the purpose of

the Town Charter, the Building Committee shall be charged with the responsibility of approving plans and specifications for any school building project as required by Section 1416 of the General Statutes (Revision of 1949); shall consult with the General Manager with respect to the approval of plans and the letting of contracts for any public improvement for the purpose of which said Building Committee was appointed; shall have full and complete access to the site of any such public improvement during the progress of the work thereon in order properly to discharge its functions hereunder; and shall consult with and make periodic reports and recommendations to the Board of Directors with respect to the planning and carrying out of any such public improvement.

Section 2. The Building Committee shall select two of its members to serve as Chairman and Secretary respectively. It shall carry out of any such public improvement as it may deem appropriate governing the conduct of its meetings and the exercise of its powers.

Section 3. Subject to the applicable provisions of law and of

ment of Public Works, may properly in writing delegate to it.

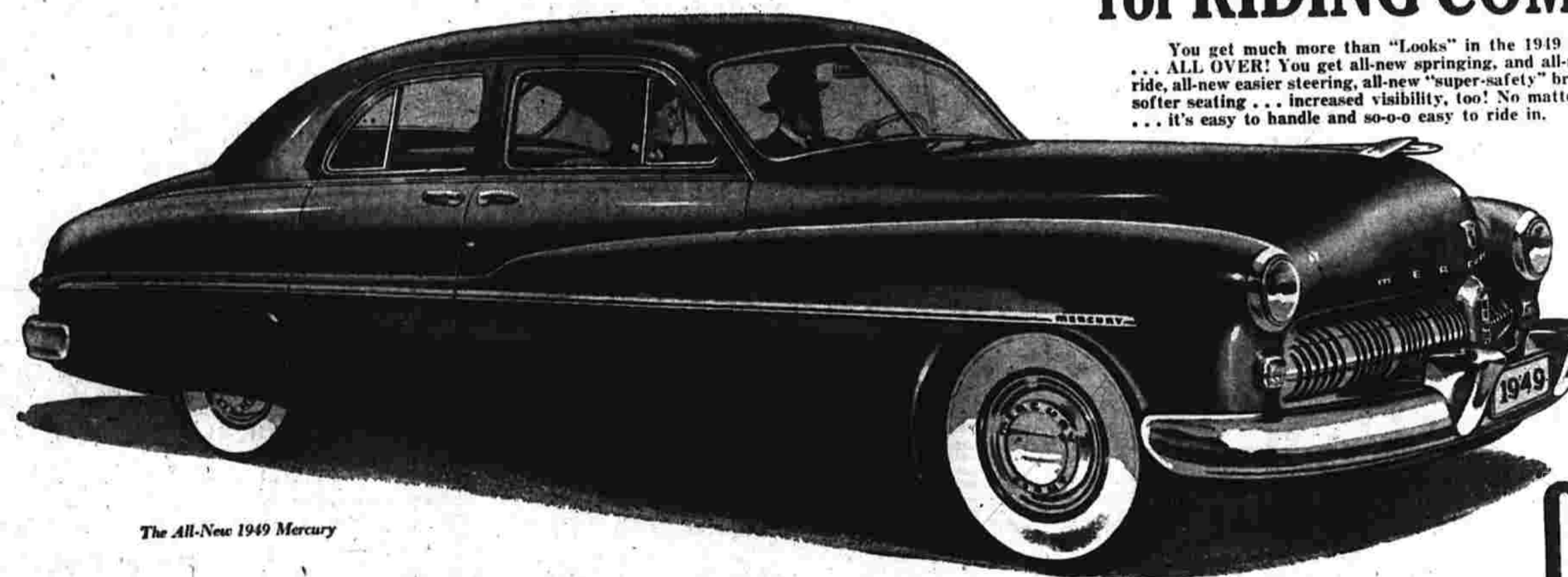

Connecticut Yankee
 By A. H. O.

If Governor Chester Bowles and his own publicity advisers had not been so busy with the question of the act, it is assumed the two parties really have any desire to meet each other, each is sparing for psychological advantage.

President Truman says, once more, that he will see Stalin only on an open meeting.

It would be serious about that. He knows, and has known, that Stalin will not come to Washington. Furthermore, he himself doesn't really want Stalin to come to Washington. Playing host to Stalin is a risk too great, considering the inflated and sometimes hysterical claims of the communists in this country, for this country to take.

If Mr. Truman has any serious intention of ever bringing to meet Stalin, he must be privately ready to agree, some day, to some other meeting place.

On the other hand, Prime Minister Churchill has proposed that a meeting take place in Russia or in Poland or Czechoslovakia, the latter being the most desirable of the three places; he too, if he really is serious about a meeting, must be privately ready to agree to some other place.

If these two great men can't agree on a meeting place, they might try Vienna, where, after another great war more than a century ago, the aspirations of the Russian and American peoples slowly brought to diplomatic stalemated.

The second issue involved is serious, and it is worthy. It is that Prime Minister Stalin is trying to tempt the United States into a bilateral discussion of the world situation. He is, of course, substantially right in his inference that the main question in the world today is that of relations between these two great countries, and that if they could compare their differences, the stability of the rest of the world would follow. Nevertheless, it has taken a position which cannot be retreated from, and which, having been taken, becomes something which we will engage in no purely bilateral discussion or settlement of present world issues. It is that we will take our own course with us into any conference aimed at a settlement of world conditions.

This means, in effect, that if any meeting between Stalin and Truman comes about, it will also be a meeting involving representatives of at least Britain and France. It will not be a two-power conference, in formality at least, although it may still be that in diplomatic actuality.

These are the primary difficulties in the way of a peace treaty. They can be resolved, if both sides really want to do so. There is an undercurrent difficulty, on our side, which may be more of an obstacle than either of these two great questions. That is the problem of whether or not we know, yet, what we really want in the way of cold war peace almost endemic in the relationship between school boards and the people of Manchester into a program of its own whimsical device. The Board's dispassionate education of the need kept peace with its own planning progress, and its whole conduct should stand as a model of how to conduct public business in a manner to deserve public confidence.

The conduct of the School Building Committee has been no less exemplary. Its function has been to move forward toward the Board of Education, first as an examiner, and then as a co-companion of the Board's building program, and this role it has played with quiet and foresight decision.

Add thereto should be a word said, too, for the main branch of Manchester's government, represented by the Mayor, George H. Waddell and the Board of Directors. There is, in most Connecticut towns, something almost endemic in the relationship between school boards and the people of Manchester into a program of its own whimsical device. Jury Frees Lois Hardy

Former New London Waitress Acquitted in Second Trial

Nevada City, Calif., Feb. 3.—(AP)—Once condemned to die for a "see-him" murder, Lois Hardy is free today. That, she said, proved the power of prayer.

A jury acquitted the third, 28-year-old former waitress from New London, Conn., yesterday in her second murder trial.

"Now I know the Lord answers prayers."

The state had accused her of slaying James W. McLean of San Fernando, Calif., into a mountain thick with fog, on a promise of sexual relations.

She turned McLean's head away while her husband, Joseph Hardy, shot and killed him, the prosecution contended. The Hardy's were arrested in McLean's car several days later.

The state Supreme court ordered a new trial after the first trial had been sentenced to die. The defense in the second trial had McLean had tried to force her and that Lois promised nothing of the slaying.

Hardy is serving a life sentence in San Quentin prison.

Two Men Held For Shooting

Former Convict One of Suspects Held in Wounding of Jeweler

New Haven, Feb. 3.—(AP)—Police today held two men, one of them an ex-convict, in connection with the shooting of Samuel S. Egan, 63-year-old jeweler.

Police officers Raymond J. Egan, described one of them as Philip Tommasi, 58, who is 31 years old, had served 21 years in the Westchester State Prison for armed robbery.

"Positively Identified"

Tommasi was booked on a technical charge and held without bail after, said Egan, Egan, Egan had been "positively identified" as one of two gunmen who shot him after he had been knocked down by a blow from a revolver wielded by the other.

Name of Egan's List

Meanwhile a spokesman at New Haven hospital, where Egan is recovering from two bullet wounds in the chest and three in his left arm, said the elderly man's condition was critical and that his name was on the danger list.

Tommasi said Egan, was arrested early last night, as a result of a telephone tip, which was reported to the police by a confidential source. He had been questioned and released. He had been working until recently at an order at New Haven hospital and was taken into custody in a room he had been living in a building owned by the hospital.

Egan said that two "freshly cleaned and oiled, fully loaded revolvers and some 'hoodlum' clothing" were found in the room. The weapons together with slugs found at the scene of the shooting, were given to a ballistic expert for examination. The clothing was sent to a state pathologist for analysis.

Reconstructs Shooting

In reconstructing the shooting, Egan said two men, brandishing revolvers, entered his store shortly before 9 a. m., yesterday. They entered him to a rear room, said the detective, and when he failed to move quickly the younger of the two struck him over the head with the butt of his gun. While Egan lay on the floor behind a counter, he continued, the older man fired several shots at Egan, inflicting two wounds in his chest and three in his arm. Then the pair fled, apparently without taking anything of value. Egan says that robbery was the apparent motive, however.

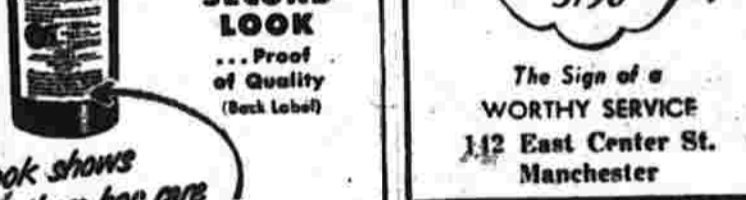

The following is the text of the resolution adopted by the Board of Directors relative to the construction and financing of new elementary schools, alterations and additions to existing schools, after the public hearing on the school problem Tuesday night.

Resolved: That, subject to approval of the voters hereinafter referred to, there be and hereby is authorized the following capital projects:

(a) the construction and original equipping and furnishing of a new elementary school to be known as the Princeton Street School, such school to be located on land of the Town located on Olcott street, substantially in accordance with plans and specifications dated January 13, 1948, prepared by Ernest Sibley and Keith Sellers Heine, Architects, the estimated cost of which is nine hundred twenty-four thousand (\$924,000) dollars;

(b) the construction and original equipping and furnishing of a new elementary school to be known as the Olcott Street School, such school to be located on land of the Town located on Broad street and for an addition to the Hollister Street School, the estimated cost of which is fifty thousand (\$50,000) dollars;

(c) the preparation of a plan and specifications for an elementary school to be built on land of the Town located on Broad street and for an addition to the Hollister Street School, the estimated cost of which is fifty thousand (\$50,000) dollars;

(d) in order to meet expenses connected with such of the capital projects hereinbefore described as are approved by the voters at an election hereinafter referred to,

of such of the foregoing projects as may be approved by the voters as hereinafter provided, whichever amount in the lesser, said bonds to be authorized by the Board of Directors under and pursuant to the provisions of the General Statutes of Connecticut (Revision, 1946), following approval of said capital projects, or a part thereof, by the voters of the Town, as required by Section 25, Chapter V of the said Charter;

That a special election be and hereby is directed to be called at the earliest appropriate date, by a notice signed by the General Manager, the Clerk and the Selection of the Town, copies of said notice to be posted on the official signposts of the Town and a copy thereof to be published in a newspaper having a circulation in the Town, such posting and publishing to be done at least five (5) days before such election, including the day of posting and publishing, but excluding the day of such election;

That if the proposed Princeton Street School project is approved by the voters, the vote, adoption by the Board of Directors at its meeting held December 14, 1948, approving an aggregate sum of thirty-nine thousand five hundred (\$39,500) dollars for architects' and engineers' fees and expenses incidental thereto and authorized by the voters, the said amount shall be added to the budget for the fiscal year 1948-1949 as an item of Capital Expenses; the sum of one million six hundred eighty-nine thousand (\$1,689,000) dollars, less the amount so represented by the aggregate of the estimated cost of such of said projects as are so approved, to be allocated as follows:

"For the construction and original equipping and furnishing of said Princeton Street School, including preliminary expenses of engineers' and architects' fees \$24,000.

"For the construction and original equipping and furnishing of said Olcott Street School, including preliminary expenses of engineers' and architects' fees \$24,000.

"For architects' and engineers' fees in connection with the preparation of plans and specifications for said Broad Street School and for said addition to the Hollister Street School \$50,000.

Total \$1,689,000.

"And it is hereby declared that studies, plans and specifications in connection with the Town's elementary school building program have but recently been completed, that there is need for immediate action to proceed with said program, that the estimated costs thereof are deemed necessary because of conditions unforeseen at the time of preparation of said annual budget and that it is in the best interest of the Town to make such additions to said budget;

"That because the foregoing appropriations and additions to the budget for the current fiscal year will increase the total of the expenditure side of said budget for said fiscal year, it is hereby determined that said appropriations and additions be financed by a bond issue of the Town, the aggregate amount of which shall not exceed one million six hundred eighty-nine thousand (\$1,689,000) dollars or the total estimated cost

thorizing the transferring of said amount from the "Municipal Reserve Fund" shall thereupon be resumed to the extent that said vote relates to fifteen thousand five hundred (\$15,500) dollars for the proposed school on Princeton Street and said sum shall be included in the appropriation of seven hundred fifteen thousand (\$715,000) dollars for said project, and that, if the proposed Olcott Street project is so approved by the voters, said vote of the Board of Directors adopted December 14, 1948, shall thereupon be resumed to the extent that said vote relates to twenty-four thousand (\$24,000) dollars for the proposed school on Olcott Street, and said sum shall be included in the appropriation of one hundred twenty-four thousand (\$124,000) dollars for said project.
