**Utility Plans New Spending**

Consolidation of the facilities of the Connecticut Power Company during 1948 cost about \$4,000,000, and about the same amount will be spent in 1949. This was announced today in the Annual Report by Samuel Ferguson, President and Chairman of the Board, which has been mailed to stockholders in a separate issue of the Annual Meeting, scheduled for March 2. A part of these large capital expenditures, which have been made in previous years if the equipment and material had been available. To raise the money required for them, a \$4,000,000 issue of 5% bonds was authorized in November of 1948. The issue increased the company's mortgage debt to 46% of its total capitalization, and the report indicates that additional capital will be required in 1949 or 1950. Gas and electric plant carried on the company's balance sheet at cost amounted to \$39,800,000 on December 31, 1948. An increase of \$8,000,000 in revenue from electric sales, and an increase of \$20,000,000 in revenue from gas sales, will be required to meet permanent electric rate increases as well as further increases in gas rates.

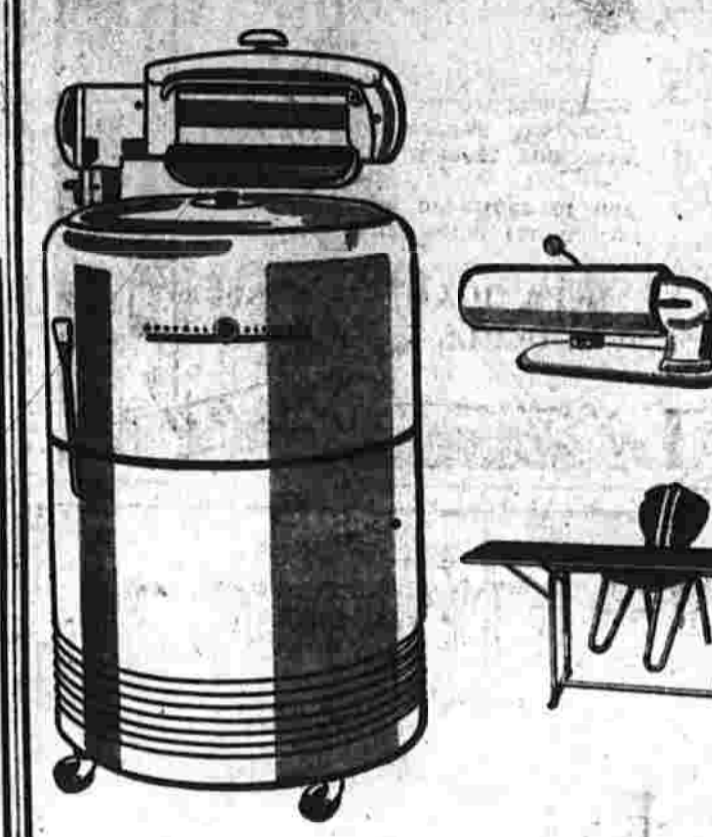
