Government Steps Into Dark Picture of Transit Strike

Walkout Costing Business and Industry in Philadelphia Estimated \$10,000,000 Daily—No Settlement Seen in Sight by Quill. Philadelphia, Feb. 12.—(AP)—The U. S. turned peace-maker today as a strike of 11,000 transit workers went into the second day, costing business and industry an estimated \$10,000,000 daily. The picture remained dark. "There is no settlement in sight," said Michael Quill, international president of the CIO-Transport Workers union. He thinks the strike might be long—a month, maybe. Local Union President Andrew J. Keelin was a bit more optimistic. "We hope the new mediation will help us end the strike quickly," Keelin said. William J. MacReynolds, vice president of the Philadelphia Transportation company, said the federal mediator "merely explored" the situation. He reported that sides stood pat at last night's negotiations—there was no discussion of a settlement. Negotiations continue today. The dispute is over wages and working conditions. The union demands a fourth round wage boost of 20 cents an hour. The PTC offered three cents. Workers' pay ranges from \$1.09 to \$1.48 an hour. Thousands of men and women in the nation's third largest city are discovering how to walk, loaf and fan. Automobiles and trucks, bumper to bumper, clog Philadelphia's streets during rush peaks and to and from. Suburban railway trains are jammed. Many persons hitch-hike. FCO normally transports 3,200,000 passengers daily over its 100-mile subway, bus and street car lines. John Murray of the U. S. Commerce Dept. said the strike is "a major emergency." Northern New England also is affected. The strike is expected to last at least a week. The mercury also touched sub-zero temperatures in the Northeast and central parts of the country. New Labor Bill Being Planned

Two Republican Senators Probably Will Offer New Measure. Washington, Feb. 12.—(AP)—Two Republican senators said today they probably will offer a new labor bill with no provision for injunctions against "national emergency" strikes. Senators Morse (R-Ore) and Ives (R-NY) said they are hopeful that the bill will be passed along with the measure. While the bill Morse and Ives are working on would junk the Taft-Hartley law section which lets the government get 90-day injunctions to halt critical strikes which would preserve several other provisions. Morse is a member of the Senate Labor committee which is studying the administration's labor bill. Ives, a former member, is generally regarded as a labor relations expert. The administration bill would repeal the Taft-Hartley law and restore the old Wagner act with some changes. Like the measure Morse and Ives are drafting, it does not provide for court orders to stop strikes which endanger national health or safety. But the similarity ends there, many labor leaders say. The new measure contains some of the ideas that went into the Taft-Hartley law. Based on Bill Approved in 1947. The new bill is based chiefly on one which the Senate Labor committee approved July 20 in 1947. Additional restrictions on union activity were written into that measure over the opposition of Morse and Ives, and in some cases Taft. It eventually became the Taft-Hartley law. However, the 80-day injunction provision was in the 1947 committee bill and all three senators voted for it in committee. Morse says it was a compromise on his part which he now regrets. He says he is willing to abandon the injunction because "it hasn't caused all kinds of trouble."

Methodist Bishop Asserts Action Deliberate Violation of Bulgarian Constitution. Geneva, Switzerland, Feb. 12.—(AP)—Methodist Bishop Paul N. Gardner said today the arrest of 15 Protestant clergymen in Bulgaria on treason and espionage charges was a deliberate violation of the Bulgarian constitution. In addition to the 15 who were arrested, Communist American and British clergymen, educators and officials who, he said, acted as "contacts" in the spying activities. Dr. Gardner, former dean of the Duke University Divinity school and the resident bishop of his church for central and southern Europe, and two prominent workers in the World Council of Churches were included in the list of alleged "contacts." Gardner's formal statement said the World Council has formally stated last night denying that its officers had engaged in spying activities in Bulgaria. The statement said council representatives had visited that country with "no other motivation than the Christian love." Dr. Gardner said today he visited Bulgaria last in November, 1947, when he attended the annual Methodist conference in Sofia. He added: "My visit was connected entirely with religious affairs pertaining to the Methodist church. No action on my part can be construed as relating in any way to the political situation now existing in Bulgaria." "My visit was not made in secret, for while in Sofia upon their invitation I had conferred with foreign agents, Kimon Georgiev, and the minister of culture Dimitar Iliev. Both of them assured me there would be religious freedom for all in Bulgaria." "Explaining that he knew persons who are spreading an 'almost absolute' lie about the Bulgarian government, Dr. Gardner said: "I know that no Methodist leader in what the world is guilty of plotting against the state." 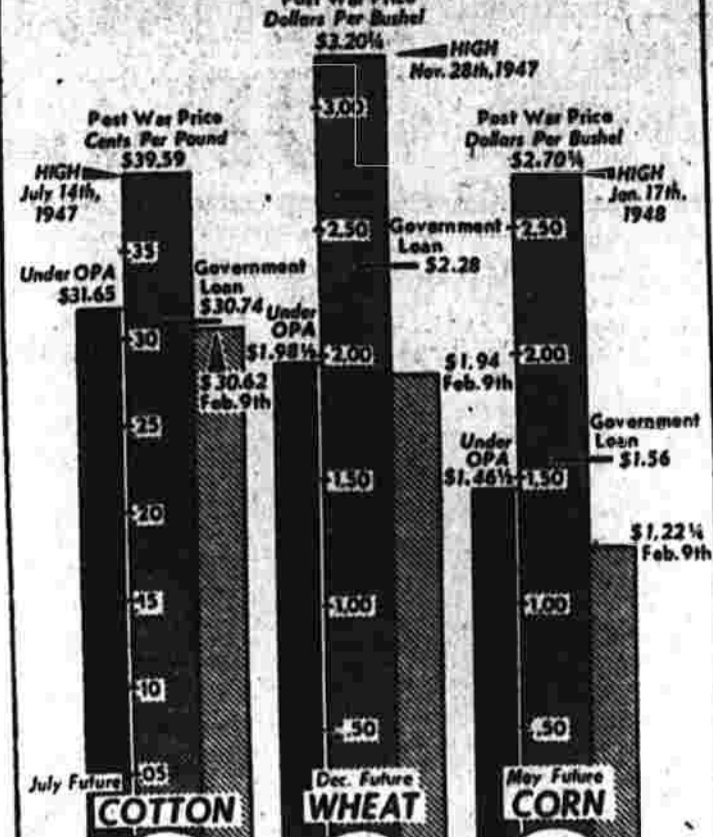
