**Rent Controls Under Attack**

**Protesting Landlords Go to Capitol Hill To Assail Program**

Washington, Feb. 15.—(AP)—Protesting landlords went to Capitol Hill today and assailed rent control as "confiscation of property" and "un-American."

Some carried threats of mass evictions of their tenants—of Congress grants President Truman request for continued rent control. Earlier in the day, rent control advocates called for strengthening, broadening and a two-year extension of rent control.

The property owners opened their own House Banking committee. Housing Expediter Robert C. Hayden, who presided, said that the program is needed to stop a growing black market in rent.

John E. Owen, president of the National Apartment Owners association, did not discuss evictions but said that the program is actually confiscation of property and a mockery of personal dignity and an encroachment on property rights.

He said rent control has actually increased the evil it was meant to remedy by discouraging the construction of new rental property and by driving hundreds of thousands of housing units out of the rental market.

The National Association of Home Builders dropped in a complaint that rent controls are "un-American," by discriminating against one class—the investors in real estate, large and small.

To the local show the ever-happy "Goldwood Michael," recognized as one of the top obedience dogs in the country, captured the fancy of local fans. "Mike" is holder of 10 perfect scores in obedience competition, a world record.

for a while, if the trial was postponed. The offer was not accepted. The negotiations were conducted. The only use is to give the Vatican a diplomatic colony here. "But it was a matter of situation," the spokesman said.

"The Vatican admitted," Reval said, "that it could not maintain its position in Hungary. It was an earlier offer by Yugoslavia to release Alojzije Stepinac, archbishop of Zagreb, who was held in the Vatican. The Hungarian government did its best before two years ago to release Stepinac on charges of treason."

Archbishop Stepinac's judges said he was a "traitor" and a "fate which also befell those responsible for the arrest, trial and sentencing of the cardinal."

"The Vatican cannot come to a compromise," in such cases, the informant added. "The Catholic people here will not accept a compromise. They can come to Rome and say they desire of course, but the Vatican would ordinarily not recall them under such pressure."

The audience will then be given the opportunity to question the speakers or to make any remarks they desire. It is anticipated that from this meeting ideas and suggestions may be obtained that will help shape future programs by which the average citizen can foster his idea of world government through means akin to the present United Nations Assembly.

**Absentee Ballot Problem Arises**

The question of absentee ballot voting on the school appropriation referendum has come up, according to Town Clerk Samuel J. Turkington who will see a decision on the matter from Town Council Charles B. House. The referendum will be held Thursday from 8 a. m. to 8 p. m. in the four voting districts of the town.

Town Clerk Turkington said he finds no reference in the town charter to absentee voting, although the general statutes establish the right for absentee voting on town elections. And some of the speakers at the meeting had questions included as part of the voting referendum.

**1948 Deaths Hit Low for State**

Hartford, Feb. 15.—(AP)—The state health department has reported that deaths from pneumonia, influenza, appendicitis, whooping cough and other fatal diseases were at their lowest in the state's history last year.

Heart disease and cancer were the two leading causes of deaths in Connecticut last year, heart disease causing 6,949 and cancer 6,103.

The department also estimated that 1948 births and the marriage rate in 1948 both dropped from the 1947 figures.

**Senator McMahon Receives Protest**
