Election Costs Here Boosted

\$2,500 More Appropriated at Meeting of the Directors

The Board of Directors last night was advised that a special appropriation of \$2,500 in addition to the \$6,028 already appropriated for elections may not be enough to meet voting costs for the balance of the fiscal year.

In fact, right now Registrar Edward P. Moriarty and Donald Henningway for expense expenditures of \$700 more than these sums just to get through tomorrow's referendum on schools and the March 3 vote on the issue of the ban on carnivals and dances.

General Manager George H. Waddell, evidently impatient with the registrar, whom he said had given him election cost estimates considerably lower than those they advanced last night, recommended that the \$2,500 increase be advertised for hearing be voted, leaving for future consideration any additional sum.

Three Appropriations Boosted

The election item was one of three appropriation increases which were up for public hearing last night.

The others were \$2,300 additional for Mt. Neko sanitary facilities and \$2,000 additional for completion of the county tax.

On the election cost question, Waddell reported that of the original \$6,028 appropriation \$7,730.56 had been spent and \$1,500 balance in the account is only \$297.04.

The registrar estimated that each election cost \$1,000, but they also figured that the two forthcoming referendums will total \$2,425. This is on the basis of using only two voting machines in each district.

After considerable further computation, it was said that at the present time it appears the election cost will be about \$3,200.

Waddell said that the \$2,500 asked for the future still unsettled, the \$2,000 voted the \$2,000 asked.

The directors noted that except for possible legal tangles which might result from voting on the school bond issue and otherwise at carnivals at the same time, they have been combined, the two coming referendums and saved approximately \$1,000.

Pleasant street has always been very narrow at this corner, and traffic turning in coming out of the intersection found it very hard to make the turn. The removal of this tree will also provide clear vision either way for motorists.

Trees along Autumn street are being checked, and dead branches have been cut off. The big tree at the corner of Autumn and Wellington road has been trimmed, while still another tree in the nearby vicinity has been entirely uprooted.

These improvements are being made to eliminate some of the hazards encountered by drivers, and are not intended to make speedways out of the thoroughfares. Speed limits are restricted in town and continue to be enforced every day.
