### Near Riot Flares Here At Basketball Game

Over 1,000 Persons at Army See Battle; Police and Guardsmen Stop Disturbance

Wanting by Chief of Police Hermon O. Schendel, members of the Manchester police department, and members of the local National Guard companies, averted a near riot last night at the state armory during the final ten seconds of the Eastern Professional Basketball League game between the Wallingford Veterans and the Manchester Guards. More than 1,000 fans, including several hundred from Wallingford, witnessed the disturbance. The Guards won 59 to 45.

Climax of a long evening of excitement came in the waning seconds of the game when Zeke Chadya called a personal foul on Wallingford player as he awarded Manchester two free throws. It was a deliberate foul. George Feigenbaum, a trouble maker in the night and the player responsible for the series of outbreaks, started a verbal barrage aimed at the officials, Chady and Eddie Horne. A technical foul was assessed to Feigenbaum. He was ejected from the game. He was followed by several teammates and then fans. The state armory was then in a state of confusion. This brought policemen and guardsmen into action, led by Police Chief Schendel.

Carried off to Station George Ferris, Vets player, was pushed and he started to swing and his punches were aimed. He was practically picked up and carried from the hall by Policemen Newton Taggart and Edward Winder. Ferris, dressed only in his playing tops, was taken to a waiting cruiser outside the armory and shuttled to the police station where he had a chance to cool off. Meanwhile, spectators from both sides and both ends came streaming onto the floor. Cook managed to quell the uprising but it was nearly fifteen minutes before play could be resumed. It was evident from the start of the crucial game there was something in the air. Wallingford needed the victory to get into the Eastern League playoffs. The Guards clinched a berth last week.

The game was only two minutes old when Feigenbaum started his continual nagging at official decisions and his language was so obscene in the stands and to those standing began to draw comment. The officials, realizing that the game was about to become a riot, called a timeout. Before the player started his walk to the showers, Feigenbaum and Coach Freddie Ferris of the Wallingford team came to the scorer's table. George Ferris, who was the breach of action and assisted his older brother.

Guards stopped the battle before it started.

### Dutch Trying To Set Policy

Efforts to Clarify Indonesian Policy Bolstered After Vote

The Hague, The Netherlands, Feb. 18-19—Dutch government efforts to clarify the muddled Indonesian problem were bolstered today by a strong vote of confidence from one branch of Parliament.

Meetings are to continue before cabinet officials and Dr. Louis J. M. Beel, the Hague's representative in the Dutch East Indies area, to work out unsettled policy details.

One question unanswered is what to do about Indonesian native republican leaders. These leaders, known as the "P.O. group," have publicly declared their support for the Indonesian Republic since last December. The United Nations Security Council has ordered their release.

Dr. J. H. van Marrewaert, who took over the post of minister for overseas territories in a cabinet reshuffle last week, said this question will be discussed with Beel before he returns to the Netherlands on Tuesday. The cabinet's policy on Indonesian policy will be discussed with Beel before he returns to the Netherlands on Tuesday.

The second chamber of the Dutch Parliament (House of Representatives) last night devoted 78 to 15 a motion of non-confidence in the government during debate on Indonesian policy.

During the debate Premier Willem Drees said Dr. Beel wanted Dutch Indonesian aims to fit into Dutch policy of the United States.

He said other members of the cabinet, however, were not optimistic about the agreement with the United States. Drees denied that Beel represented the cabinet and Dr. Beel's position on Indonesia in his differences with the cabinet.

In Accord With Position Beel, according to van Marrewaert, is in complete accord with the recently announced government position that the Dutch are ready to negotiate with the Indonesian Republic to carry out the U. N. Security Council order to grant "eventual" independence.


