**The Road to "Brotherhood"**  
 "Brotherhood Week" one of those many "weeks" which deserve something more than passing attention and thought, is now being observed throughout the nation. It is a week dedicated to the improvement of both relationships and thought among Americans. It will be a week full of pious and serious and well-intended words, all aimed at the great vision of tolerance and understanding. "But of all the words that will be said, none will go more truly to the heart of the problem than the words of the Rev. John S. Kennedy, addresser of the Manchester Inter-Faith meeting, held a week ago. Father Kennedy was so bold as to say that "tolerance," the professed goal of so many who interest themselves in the cause of better Anglo-American relationships, was "not enough." Something else was required. "This something else," he said, was "love."

And this is a quality and a thing which is not to be pronounced from pulpits, or even to be advanced by newspaper headlines or editorials. It cannot be artificially imposed upon American life because it is supposed to be a good thing.

It is not a thing or a quality which will be advanced even by Inter-Faith meetings, or even by a "Brotherhood Week."  
 It is something that has to be discovered in the warp and woof of ordinary living. It is something that has to be discovered in act and feeling before it can be understood in theory.

To have any of us tolerating one another because we have been told that is the thing "we ought to do" is almost a worthless gain.

The only thing that counts is for us to leap ahead of mere tolerance into genuine acceptance; because we have learned to like and respect one another.

Actions, not words, advance the cause of genuine brotherhood. And they should be actions which are springing from a developing human heart, not from some artificial desire of the mind. They should be actions which are natural, rather than forced.

And unless the so-called movement toward "Brotherhood" is rooted in heart, and in sincerity, it is rooted in a developing love for all mankind and all kinds of men, a love rooted in the concept that all men are brothers under the Fatherhood of God, then, under the movement falls from these standards into the province of the glib linguists who have set up brittle codes and procedures which they label "care" more harm than good is often likely to be done.

If "Brotherhood Week" is to have any value, let it be no time set apart, but a beginning of thought and feeling which will grow inside the context of ordinary living the whole year round.

And it is very important. For such a revival of the natural trade of Europe is the only thing which can really produce European recovery, and bring the Marshall Plan to a successful conclusion.

We went to the San Francisco conference in 1947, immediately after having held a hemisphere conference in which we had originated the first of these exceptions to the United Nations principle of our own special alliance with our own hemisphere neighbors.

It was in order to get this hemisphere alliance of our own making, and to get it into the United Nations that we insisted on a special Charter provision.

That made it entirely legal and proper for Russia, in its turn, to negotiate all kinds of regional alliances with its own neighbors.

And now, as well, it makes it legal for us to take the North Atlantic Defense Pact, in which a group of nations may undertake to wage itself into a special military bloc—all under the legal blessing of the United Nations Charter, and all for the pious purpose of "strengthening" the dear United Nations.

Actually, every one of these regional pacts and military arrangements, whether by Russia or by ourselves, is one more weakening of the prestige of the United Nations, and one more violation of the spirit and principle of the United Nations. For if the nations accepted the United Nations for what it should be, and intended to live fully up to their own obligations as members of the United Nations, they could not and would not be so busy making conflicting arrangements for their own policies.

Still, the hypocritical case for these regional alliances is advanced by so many high statesmen, and even by the Secretary General of the United Nations, and incidentally, a Norwegian statesman, felt the need to be rather subtle, the other day when he discussed those regional pacts which threaten to tear the heart out of the United Nations as such.

Said Mr. Lie, delicately: "No regional arrangement can be a satisfactory substitute for the United Nations. If people generally began accepting alliances as a substitute for genuine, worldwide collective security, then the cause of a lasting peace would be greatly endangered."
