Signs of becoming involved in the civil rights battle from an entirely different quarter.

Senator Buckley (R., Ohio) proposed an amendment to the Senate Labor committee that any new labor law include a requirement to make unions treat Negroes and white alike. Senators of both parties were giving that proposal serious thought.

Meanwhile, Senator Russell (D., Ga.) asked the southern group to meet at 2 p. m. to try to oppose the anti-billboard resolution, which would permit the Senate to gag debate at any time by a two-thirds vote of the members.

Russell told reporters the Senate may become involved in a fight that would defeat "all worthwhile legislation in this session."

The issue might wind up squarely in the lap of Vice President Alben Barkley, the senate's presiding officer.

If sixteen senators sign a petition to invoke cloture (debate limit), then Barkley may have to rule whether or not the gag can be applied to debate on a motion.

Last year, Senator Vandenberg (R., Mich.), then the Senate's presiding officer, held that debate on a motion for cloture cannot be gagged.

At that time, Barkley, then minority floor leader, took issue with the ruling. He argued cloture should be applied to any debate.

Barkley has not disclosed how he would rule in such a case now that he is Senate president.

Race Question Enters Battle

Rights of Negroes in Unions Being Given Serious Consideration.

Washington, Feb. 24.—The question of rights for Negroes was thrust today into the steaming Senate battle over a new labor bill. Senators of both parties were giving serious consideration to a suggestion that any new labor law enacted by Congress should include provisions to treat white and Negro workers alike. At present some unions bar Negroes or give them a special type of membership.

Finally Ends Hearings

The issue cropped up unexpectedly during the Senate Labor committee hearings on a bill to amend the National Labor Relations Act. The committee had been holding hearings for several days on a bill to amend the Wagner act and its amendments.

Senator Humphrey (D-Minn.) told reporters "I hope it goes in."

"I think," said Senator Taft (R-Ohio), "that we've had to do something about this matter."

Senator Morris (R-Ore.) who stands somewhere between Taft and Humphrey on labor legislation said: "I will give the proposal careful consideration."

Ends First Big Skirmish

Adjustment of the hearings ended the first big skirmish in the congressional battle over what to do about the Taft-Hartley act.

President Truman and his supporters in Congress are backing a bill to amend and substitute the original Wagner act and its amendments.

Yesterday William Levermore, widely known as a labor-management arbitrator and former member of the National Labor Relations Board, threw his weight behind that bill.

Taft-Hartley, he said, is "no good." Democrats on the committee beamed. Taft opposed it with his table-thumping.

The next scene in the drama will be staged with the curtain down behind closed doors—starting either tomorrow or Monday—the committee will discuss the administration bill and vote on various proposals to change it before bringing it to the Senate floor for public debate.

Doublets Change in Votes

Senator Neely (D., W. Va.) proclaimed yesterday that the Senate hearings had produced "more noise than light on the subject" and he doubts whether any senator's vote was changed.

Mores differed. He told reporters the hearings were of an "exceptionally high order" and he believed that among both the Republicans and Democrats, "many points of view on various issues have been changed."

The racial question was brought up by two Negro witnesses, Edgar G. Brown, director of the National Negro Council, and Elmer W. Henderson, director of the American Council on Human Rights.

Both asked Congress to deny the closed shop and the machinery of the NLRB to unions which discriminate against workers on racial or religious grounds.

This is the proposal which Humphrey says he is for.

Does Let Further

Brown went a lot further. He proposed that the Truman administration bill for a fair employment practice commission be incorporated in the Thomas labor bill. He said the fair employment bill would "never" pass Congress by itself.

"This suggestion got no support from Democrats on the committee."

"Oh, no," said Humphrey, "we'll fight that out as a separate bill."

Some observers familiar with the political situation in the Middle East said top and two governments might settle by the present armistice negotiations are concluded.

Most of the Arab and Iraqi governments were believed to be in the most danger of falling.

Using 1040 Short-Form Cuts Task on Returns

Sometimes One May Reduce Amount of Taxation by Use of Long Form, However

(Editor's Note: This is the first of 12 stories on which we are doing a series on the 1040 short-form returns for the 1948 tax year.)

Washington, Feb. 24.—Using the 1040 short-form for your 1948 income tax return is easier than using the 1040 long-form.

Both are part of Form 1040. It's called the short-form when, without figuring, you find your tax in the table of estimated tax payments.

It's called the long-form when you figure your own tax according to a formula on Page 2.

Anyone Can Use Long Form

The short-form is available to all taxpayers—only those with under-\$5,000 can use the long form. And those with \$5,000 or more have to use it. They have no choice.

The short-form mainly is for those under-\$5,000 people, like landlords or others from whose 1948 income no matter how early they wish to file.

In such cases the return merely explains on the return that the husband or wife died during the year.

Even though the short-form is easier than the long-form, sometimes you may save money by using the long-form. For example, in getting deductions.

Anyone using the short-form can't take a 10 per cent deduction for deductible expenses of the hospital, utility, insurance, and so on.

You don't have to itemize them, or even claim the 10 per cent. It's already allowed for in the tax table you use with the short-form.

But you'll save money by using the long form if you have more than 10 per cent.

Standard Deductions

In that case you'll have to figure your own tax and itemize your deductions to prove them, but you can claim them in full.

To save money, husbands and wives should think carefully about 1040 short-form: When to use it, how to use it, whether to use it.

If their combined income was under \$5,000, husband and wife can file jointly on the short-form. Some will save money by doing it.

That's because of the new law that permits couples to "split" their income. In "Yaldage" claimed half, and this gets a lower tax. Example:

Urges Buying Rifle Range

Federal Government Will Spend \$30,000 If Property Bought

Bartford, Feb. 24.—The Connecticut National Guard can obtain a \$35,000 rifle range if the state is willing to spend \$5,000, the General Assembly's Appropriation Committee was told yesterday.

Col. James M. Quinn, assistant state adjutant general, said that the Federal government will spend about \$30,000 to equip the range, install rifle pits and concrete walls and provide training material.

He urged approval of a bill which would authorize the state Military department to buy the Foot Guard's Westgate rifle range in Bartford for \$5,000. The state now rents the range for \$500 a year.

Quinn explained that the state must buy the range or lease it for 99 years in order to obtain the Federal funds.

He also asked the committee to approve another measure authorizing the Military department to buy four and a half acres in Mystic from the Cottrell Lumber Company for \$4,000.


