**Travel Fund Plan Reality**

**Isidor Wise, Hartford Merchant, Establishes Foundation Today**

Hartford, March 7.—(AP)—A long-time dream of Isidor Wise, Hartford merchant, is being made a reality today as he announced the establishment of the Isidor Wise Travel Foundation.

Wise, who has been a member of the United Nations Charter since its inception, and who has been active in promoting the cause of world peace, announced the establishment of the foundation today. Launched with a capital fund of \$10,000, it is in the donor's opinion the only one of its kind in the country today.

Interest on the fund will provide two Hartford public school students to be selected each year with all expenses for annual trips to points of historical interest. One trip will be to a point within the country, the other to a point in a foreign land.

Wise said boys or girls will be selected yearly on the basis of their proficiency in American history. "All my life," said Mr. Wise, "I have traveled to all parts of the world. I know how one will be broadened, will be made more tolerant, more tolerant of ideas and customs not our own. Travel teaches us to make allowances and understand."

I, Harold A. Turkington, Mayor of the Town of Manchester, do hereby proclaim the week of March 6-12 as "World Government Week." I sincerely urge every citizen of our community to give serious consideration to the greatest problem facing our civilization, that of World Peace, so we may play an active part in the strengthening of the United Nations into a World Government, with power to make and enforce World Law, thereby preserving our civilization from the ravages of war, from which no race, no nation, no family can be sure they are immune.

**Tactics are Important**

Molotov may have been kicked upstairs or he may have been really promoted to a position of even greater power. There may be differences between Molotov and Vishinsky, and there may not. The shifts in the Moscow hierarchy may denote internal weakness and trouble, and they may denote the consolidation of Soviet political strength. They may mean new toughness on the part of Russian diplomacy, and they may mean new Russian pleasantness.

The diplomats and the analysts of the western world present these alternative possibilities with propriety or modesty and humility. They admit they don't know just what the Russian cabinet shifts may mean. Neither do we.

But after they get through admitting this much, all the analysts and statesmen fall back on what they regard as one sure and safe assurance. It is the warning that, although Soviet tactics may shift one way or another, Russia's basic aims will not change. It is a warning that whatever Russia seems to be doing, it won't really be important. It is a warning that, whatever play-acting the Russians may indulge in, we are not to be taken in; we are to pursue our own changeless course.
