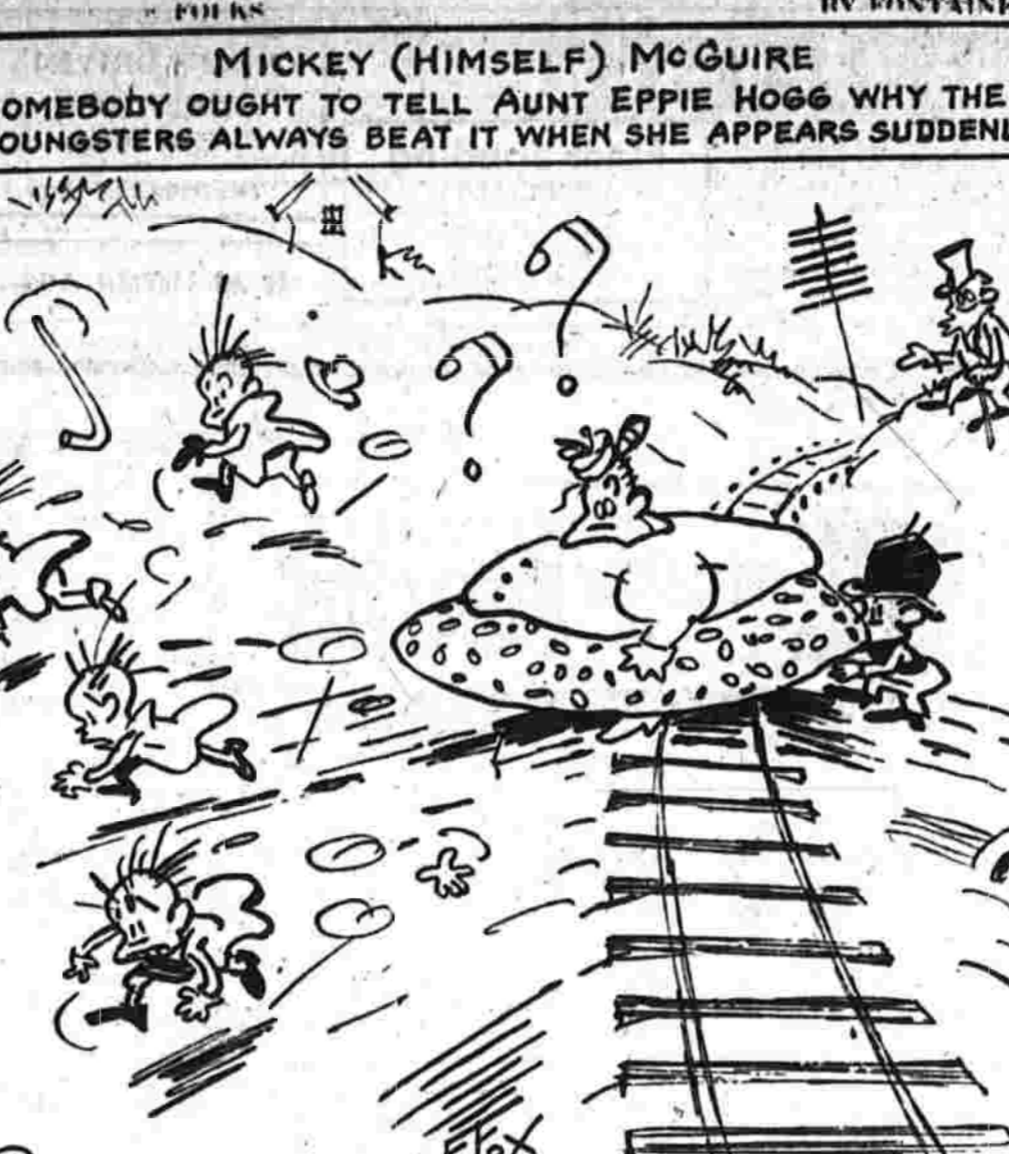

Captain Haar Dies in Crash

Former Local Man Was Wounded Known Because Of Trips to Alaska

Captain Robert M. Haar, 31, former local man serving with the U. S. Air Corp, was killed Monday, March 14, in an airplane crash in the Philippines, according to a telegram from Honolulu.

Born in Long Island City, N. Y., in 1917, Capt. Haar came to Manchester in 1934 and was graduated from Manchester high school with the class of 1935. Later he entered Hillier College in Hartford and was then employed as a construction engineer for several firms, the first of which was Haas Construction Co.

Had Many Friends Here

Capt. Haar made many friends locally and was perhaps best known for his trips to Alaska. On his return he visited several local schools telling of his experiences. He spent three years in Alaska and made several discoveries of uncharted lakes and volcanic craters. At 22, he was the youngest member of the Explorers Club of New York.

Enlisting in the air corps, in May, 1942, Capt. Haar was assigned to photography missions over many parts of the world, including the Aleutians and Far East and Europe. Cited by General Vandenberg for meritorious service in the Aleutians, he was discharged after 100,000 miles of six-month period of his service.

Discharged in 1946, Capt. Haar was employed in an art department in Washington, D. C. He later gained renown as the founder and chairman of the National Draft Eisenhower for President club that sprang up from coast-to-coast.

The former local man was called back into the service by the War Relocation Authority in Hawaii. Besides his parents he leaves his wife, Mrs. Alice M. Haar, one daughter, Barbara N. Haar, and one son, Arthur Griffith Haar, of New York, Conn.

Stoppage Hits River Traffic

Pittsburgh, March 18.—(AP)—Freight traffic on the Ohio river was hit severely today as 46,000 coal miners started the fifth day of a "hard hat" strike.

About 90 per cent of the freight hauled on rivers in the Pittsburgh district was held up by the strike, mainly in coal.

Barge movements are infrequent these days.

River spokesmen said figures on the number idled are not available.

Most of the miners found occupations for their spare time, even if only making repairs around their homes.

In Hazleton, Pa., about 50 stalwarts of John Lewis' clan hauled out hammer and nails and shovels and began to renovate the local base.

Last Monday, under orders of the United Mine Workers' chief, all miners east of the Mississippi began a two-week work stoppage, memorial to the 100,000 dead and maimed comrades. Lewis also proclaimed the holiday a protest against appointment of John Boyd as U. S. Bureau of Mines director.
