Jobless Cases Rise Sharply

Increased 151 Per Cent in Year; Biggest Jump in Bridgeport

Hartford, March 22—The number of jobless claimants for unemployment insurance benefits in Connecticut rose to 62,537 during the week ended March 19 from 55,007 for the previous week. The total was 151 per cent higher than the 24,885 who filed a year ago. Benefits paid out last week amounted to \$51,548.

Initial claims, which start a new claims action, declined to 7,248 from 7,909 for the previous week. Bridgeport led the state in the number of jobless claimants with 10,147 followed by New Haven 8,748, Hartford 8,110 and Waterbury 7,507. The other fifteen cities were each under 3,500.

A steel and wire products firm laid off 500, a brass company 100, a watch factory 150 and a chain manufacturer 110 with little or no work in the bearings industry. Other lack of work in the bearings industry. 250 in metal products, 90 in ordinance, 45 in hair and 30 in textiles. A razor manufacturer reported 200 layoffs. The Bridgeport office reported the following layoffs due to lack of work: 30, locks 25, chains 30, a roofing material factory laid off 30 for one week and an appliance company 25 temporarily. A Bristol bearings plant laid off 200 due to lack of work.

In the Danbury area three hat companies laid off a total of 85 due to lack of work.

The Danville office reported a layoff of 60 by a rayon dress goods shop due to insufficient orders. A Hartford chain manufacturer laid off 90.

In the Manchester area 25 were out of work due to a fire at a small tool plant.

The Meriden office reported a layoff of 90 by a bearings plant and 35 by a silversware concern due to lack of work.

In the New Britain area a chuck manufacturer laid off 50, a bearing plant 25 a metal products firm 25 and an electrical products shop 20 with lack of work the reason in each instance.

A New Haven watch company laid off 150 while reorganizing. A steel and wire products company laid off 300 and an iron fittings factory 25 due to lack of work.

The Norwalk office reported a layoff of 45 by a toy maker and 30 by a ladies' suit shop due to lack of orders.

In the Norwich area a plastics company laid off 35.

A Stamford razor company required 30.

In the Thompsonville area two women companies laid off a total of 40 temporarily.

The Torrington office reported a layoff of 20 by a maker of small metal products. A fur company placed 40 on a 24-hour week.

Probate Court Issue Argued

Hartford, March 22—(P)—Are some probate judges overpaid? That question was argued yesterday before a legislative committee, as it has been at every session of the General Assembly for more than a decade.

The occasion was the biennial hearing on bills to put the probate judges on salary and eliminate the fee system by which they have been compensated.

Opponents of the fee system said that some of the probate judges—those in the largest districts—take in more money than

the salaries received by Superior and Supreme Court judges, the state's highest paid judicial officers.

Prostate Commission Unfair
Judge Russell E. Johnson of the Hartford Probate district, the largest in the state, protested that the comparison was unfair.

Superior and Supreme court judges receive many benefits that probate judges do not. He said. They do not have to stand for election, are retired as state referees at two-thirds of their salaries, may be pensioned if they become disabled and their widows receive a life pension of 25 per cent of their husband's salary. Probate judges receive none of these benefits, said Johnson, but must provide for their own security out of current earnings.

Several bills were before the committee. One, presented by Senator Luke H. Stapleton (R-Cheshire), himself a probate judge, would establish a salary schedule ranging from \$500 a year for judges in 28 sparsely populated districts to \$15,000 a year for judges in Waterbury, Bridgeport, Hartford and New Haven.

Senator Alfred F. Wheeler of Hartford, Democratic Senate leader, proposed a bill retaining the fee system, but requiring judges to turn over a percentage of their fees to the Probate assembly. Under the schedule, the highest possible probate income would be \$16,274 a year.

Irwin Friedman, a Bridgeport lawyer, urged the Judiciary committee, which conducted the hearing, to study recommendations made by a state commissioner two years ago. That commission, headed by Justice Nevill Jennings of the state Supreme court, recommended that the number of probate districts be reduced from 120 to 45. Friedman said the commission's recommendations would make possible a savings of \$340,000 a year.
