Move to Name New School For Late Herbert O. Bowers

A movement has been started among some residents of the north section of town to have the new grade school on Princeton street, ground for which was broken Saturday, named the "Herbert O. Bowers School." The late Judge Herbert O. Bowers was one of the most active educators in Manchester during the first quarter of the 1900's. He was secretary of the Board of School Visitors for Manchester from 1882 until the time of his illness which took his life on November 30, 1927.
