Warden Edward T. Bement of Portland reported to Dr. Russell P. Hunter this morning that Elmer Gibson netted 15 of the shad and Timothy Cofe took two. Unsuccessful fishermen in the first tries were Angelo Baldi, Amos Swain and Howard R. Clark.

Though small, the catches were the state of the sawning grounds, as far as was known, only the five downtiver men flahed last night, Dr. Hunter said.

Last year, 175,250 shad were taken by 167 licensed netters. The season was considered "disappointing" by the commercial men who remembered the great spawning runs of 1946 when 301,556 shad were taken.

During the season shad will be allowed to go upstream unmolested on "rest days." These periods, set to permit an ample number of shad to reach spawning grounds.






