Rockville, April 4—(Special)—George B. Forster, for three terms mayor of the City of Rockville, passed away this morning at the Rockville City Hospital at the age of 80. A political leader in Rockville and Tolland county he was active in the Democratic party. He served eight years as postmaster having received his appointment from Woodrow Wilson in 1916. He was Tolland County sheriff and was a delegate to one of the National Democratic conventions.

Mr. Forster was born in Seneca Falls, N. Y., on July 16, 1869, the son of Joseph and Sebastiana Pricker Forster and had been a resident of Rockville for many years. He was first elected mayor in 1901.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Elias Forster and one son, George B. Forster, of Rockville. Funeral services will be held at the Burke Funeral home at 8:15 Wednesday morning in the parlors. Revolt Crushed In Costa Rica
 San Jose, Costa Rica, April 4.—A Costa Rican second revolt in four months has been crushed by Juan Figueres, head of the military junta governing the republic.

The rebellion broke out late Saturday and was all over yesterday morning.

Figueres' war minister, Edgar Cardona, seized two Army barracks and demanded the cancellation of laws nationalizing banks and imposing a 10 per cent tax on capital. He also demanded the resignations of the ministers of Finance and Labor.

Cardona surrendered the artillery barracks when his revolt was only a few hours old. The other rebel strongholds in the country were given up shortly after dawn Sunday when government troops entered seven districts.

Mandalay Taken From Rebel Units
 Rangoon, Burma, April 4.—The government announced today it has taken Mandalay from rebel Karen forces.

The picturesque temple city 500 miles north of Rangoon was occupied by the Karen and their Communist allies March 23.

The government announcement said the city was taken yesterday after a series of swift attacks. The rebels were said to have lost 30 killed. Government casualties were not announced.

Mandalay was reported leveled as the sound of battle trailed toward Myanmar.

Retired Yale Professor Dies
 New Haven, April 4.—John M. Berdan, 74, Yale University professor emeritus, died yesterday.

When Berdan retired in 1941, President Charles Seymour of Yale said the United States never received a teacher more skillful in the field of English composition.

Berdan graduated from Yale in 1908. He received his doctor of philosophy degree from Yale in 1909 and then studied a year at the Sorbonne. He taught for two years at the Polytechnic school in Toledo, O., and last came to Yale as an assistant in rhetoric. Soon he became an instructor in English.

The university has announced it will conduct a memorial service in his honor at a date to be announced. Burial will take place in Toledo.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Anna Rodgers Berdan, and three daughters, Mrs. Edward Wray, Jr., of Litchfield; Miss Frances Berdan and Miss Jean Berdan, both of New Haven.
