Carnival Problem Again Bothers Local Officials

Police Chief is Holding Up Permit for April 18 Until He Gets A Legal Opinion

A year of circus and carnival troupe tramping out across here today as Chief of Police Herman Schmidt announced he is withholding approval of a permit for a carnival, scheduled for April 18 at the Dougherty lot on the west side, under sponsorship of the Manchester Fire Department.

Chief Schmidt said he will not issue a permit until a legal opinion, involving zoning, has been received from the town council. Schmidt said he has been advised by the town council that the holding of any show or carnival at the Dougherty lot violates provisions of the town zoning regulations.

Today Town Council House said that he is studying the matter. It was only a little over a month ago that the town, by special referendum, refused to issue a permit to an ordinance which would have banned outdoor circuses and carnivals from town.

If the petitioners are right, however, it appears that the referendum was not intended to prevent the holding of outdoor circuses and carnivals from town.

The current zoning regulations exclude carnivals and circuses from business zones and provide special permission of zoning authority is granted for one year not to exceed ten consecutive days.

However, the Dougherty lot is not in a business zone and it is not a non-conforming use under zoning laws.

Five years ago a regulation, Article IV, Section VI, paragraph 6, was adopted after hearing, in which it was provided that five years after adoption of the said regulation, all non-conforming uses shall be deemed to be discontinued.

It is reported that the regulation was placed on the books four years ago and is on the question of the exact date of adoption that legal opinion may hinge.

As things stand, carnivals are banned in business zones except on the granting of special permission. They are banned in residential zones except through the loan of non-conforming use.

The next question may be whose idea came before whom? Do the zoning regulations or referendum action have priority, and in this case, since the people voted only to approve an ordinance banning carnivals, would it in any way knock out existing zoning regulations?


