All Killed In Senate The House, representing Con-necticut's rural areas, has passed a birth control bill at several pre-vious sessions. All have been killed, however, in the Senate, where the cities, with large Cath-olic populations, predominate. Backers of the bill were mar-shalled before the committee by shalled before the committee by the Rev. Merrill Charke of New Canaan, representing the Social Action committee of the Congrega-tional Christian churches Opposing speakers were intro-duced by Fermes State Senator Joseph P. Cooney, caused for the Roman Catholic diocese of Hart-

ford.
The arguments followed the patter set in former years, although the religious issue was thrust more sharply into the foreground.
Contend Law "Antiquated"
Proponents of the bill contended

the present law against birth control was "antiquated," "ridiculous"
and "unconstitutional."
Churchmen and laymen among
the bill's backers stressed that it
was purely permissive, compelling
no one to practice birth control.
They contended the present law

Opponents accused supporters of casting "insult after insult" at the Catholic church, and of "an unChristian-like spirit." They argued that birth control was immoral, "against the laws of nature" and a danger to health.

Rely on Medical Testimony
Both sides relied heavily on medical testimony.

The Connecticut State Medical society, through its House of Delegates, has gune on record for the bill, Dr. Samuel C. Harvey, president of the society, testified.

Dr. John Foster of Waterbury, another physician appearing for another physician appearing for the bill, accused the Catholic church of conducting "a campaign of intimidation" against doctors. It is wrong, he contended that "a group which is celibate and with-out experience in sex and marriage should dictate what is right and moral."

Doctors presenting an opposition viewpoint included Dr. George E. Coggan of Hartford, who reported that incidence of cancer of the womb had increased 31.5 per cent in Connecticut in the last ten years. "Cancer may well result from the use of contraceptives," he argued.

Entire Staff Opposes Bill Dr. Cogan said the entire staff of St. Francis hospital in Hartford, of which he is president, opposed the bill.

Gilman urged the committee, fi it could not support his bill, to raise another measure attaching a "serious penalty" for violations of the present anti-birth control law.

vent. The 17th Decennial Census. y Congressional enactment, must e conducted in April of 1950. School officials and teachers of the nation have a special interest in this event. The special interest lies in the tentative proposal that the Bureau of the Census employ teachers, where it can be arrang-ed, to serve as enumerators. This proposal is now under consideraproposal is now under consideration among teaching agroups, administrators and boards of education. The Manchester Board of
Education discussed the proposal
at a recent meeting.
Under normal circumstances, it
is estimated that from 40 to 60
per cent of the teachers in any

iven area will be needed to carry on the important task.

During the war, teachers completed a most important task for the nation's welfare, the rationing

program for 150 million people. For this they received no remuneration, but it is expected that those who participate in the 1930 census will be paid from eight to ten dollars per day.

If the plan proves to be feasible, schools will need to be closed for one week during the first part of April, 1950. Thus school calendars for 1950, where teachers are to participate, will need to make provision for the closing of school during the period mentioned. However, this week will not be counted toward the 180 days required in the state of Connecticut.

In 1950, the Census Bureau is aiming for the goal of completing the best census in the nation's 180 years of experience in the work. It is for this reason that the plan to employ teachers as enumerators has been advanced because the Bureau of the Census realizes the unusual qualifications of the fachers and their record of public service.

Nation-Wide Support

Support for the plan of turning the job of consus taking in 1950 over to the teachers has come from all part of the nation. Again the Bureau would emphasize that it is

all part of the nation. Again the ureau would emphasize that it Bureau would emphasize that it is exerting no pressure in the matter. Bureau officials feel that in the final analysis it is a matter of voluntary decisions between school officials and teachers. If the proposal is to be put into effect, enumerators will be covered by

the usual government compensa-tion safeguards for accidents or injury sustained while engaged in official duties.

Best known of these is the bead system, in which lettered beads are strung on a waxed cord brace-let placed around a baby's wrist or

the delivery room places the pro-per color identification slip bearing the name into a 2½-inch hollow-die-cast holder. Trimming the notched blue or pink bracelet to correct size for the baby's wrist plastic rosette rivets which can-not be removed once they are set in place with the fingers.
Sometimes the mother wears an identical bracelet. Only by cutting can the identification be removed and when baby goes home, the bracelet usually goes along as a keepstyle.
