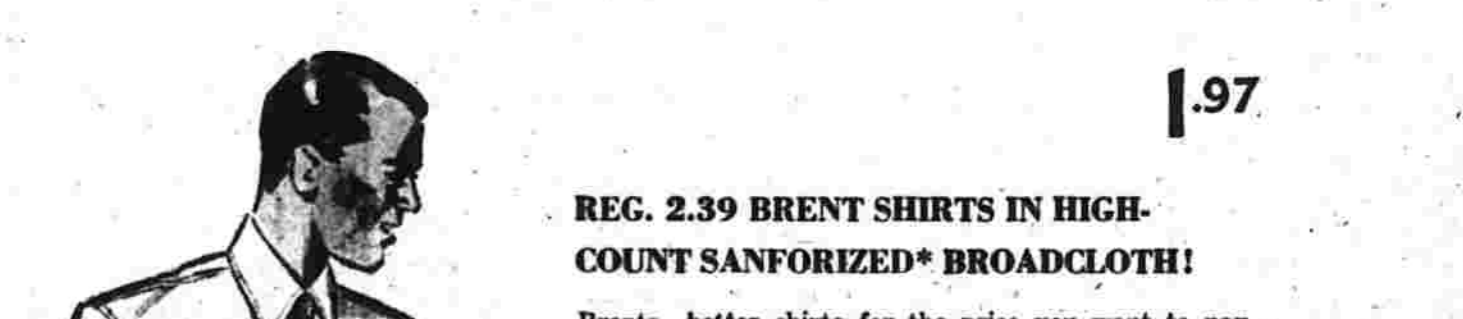

And let the people of America mass outside the gates and watch while the great men frolic. Use schoolboys about the lawn, searching for eggs.

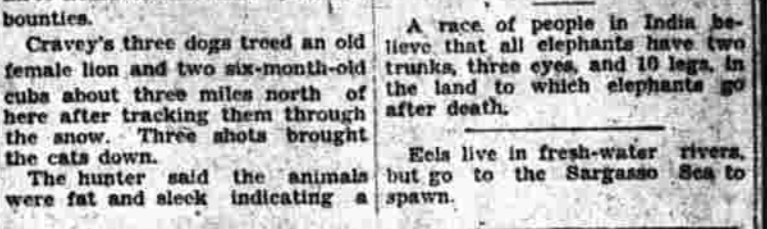

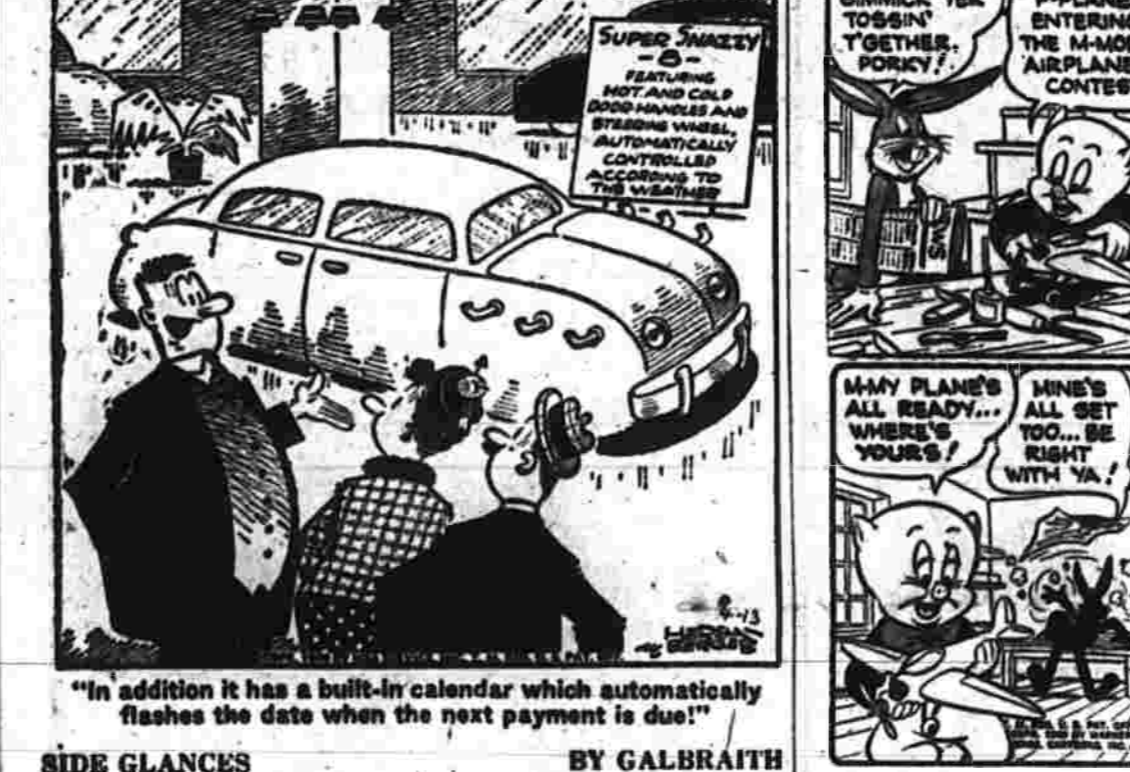

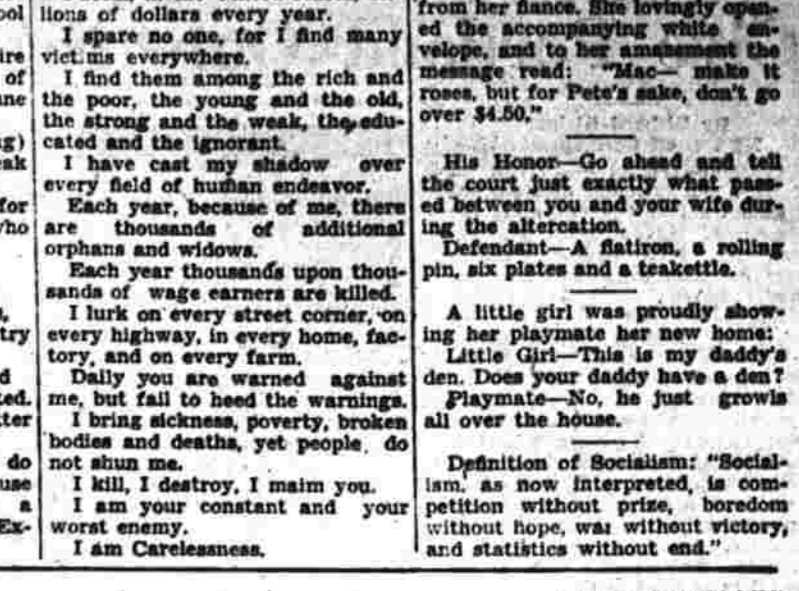
