By Edward H. Hoffman NEA Staff Correspondent Kansas City, Mo.—(NEA)—A ew plastic infant identifation bracelet is being hailed by hospital authorities as the most outstanding step in 30 years toward ending one of mother's paramount fears—the possibility of not getting her own baby.

guard against it.
Best known of these is the bead system, in which lettered beads are strung on a waxed cord brace-let placed around a baby's wrist or

the delivery room places the pro-per color identification slip bearing the name into a 2½-inch hollow-die-cast holder. Trimming the notched blue or pink bracelet to correct size for the baby's wrist plastic rosette rivets which can-not be removed once they are set in place with the fingers.
Sometimes the mother wears an identical bracelet. Only by cutting can the identification be removed and when baby goes home, the bracelet usually goes along as a keepstyle.





Nichol testified that he had his service gun in his hand as he attempted to handcuff Townsend and that when the New Haven man started to scuffle, the gun was accidentally discharged.
