Two Injured In Air Crash
Plane Demolished in Landing at Stafford Springs Today
Stafford Springs, April 15.—(P)—Last in a fog while en route from Florida to Rhode Island, a small plane crashed into a barnyard on the edge of Stafford Springs this morning. Both pilot and passenger escaped serious injury. The plane was demolished. State police at the local barracks identified the pilot as Peter J. Vecchio, 71, of Miami, Fla., and his passenger as Edward Hayden, 20, of Wallingford. Both were taken to Johnson Memorial hospital here for observation and treatment of minor injuries and shock. Making delivery of a plane, State Policeman Ernest L. Ansell, who is investigating the crash, said Vecchio was delivering a small, two-place Aerocraft "Champion" to the Smithfield Airport company, Smithfield, R. I. in Wallingford, he picked up Edward Hayden, who has a student's license, as a passenger for the last leg of the flight after leaving the plane at the airport.

Truman Cites Selective

President Truman and other advocates of Senate ratification of the North Atlantic Pact, have advanced the claim that the pact is, in essence, a security pact. He said it is only in this sense that the pact is a security pact.

Such, spinning in the universe, is the thin shell of earthly life, death just above it, and death just below it, and survival on it, at most a fragile chance, never guaranteed from one age to another.

Yet on this shell man sometimes behaves as if he owned the whole thing. As if he had planned it and could control it, as if he were its thinking master.

Then a section of the crust slips, or he happens to read statistics about the top of the world. He wonders if the atomic scientists will someday succeed in producing a chain reaction in hydrogen, and he feels, momentarily, a little insignificant. It does him no harm. And if, for compensation, he turns to the thought that there must be somewhere some indestructible, changeless strength and force his good fortune, instruments can never measure it, can do him some good.

We have made no move, since the passage of the resolution, to push any program of disarmament, or to provide the United Nations itself with armed forces. Instead, as since the end of the war, our policy has been closed against disarmament.

Fight on Oleo Still Confused

Each Side Wins Preliminary Skirmish as Different Bills Pass

Harford, April 15.—(AP)—The battle of oleomargarine against butter isn't over in the General Assembly.

Each side won a preliminary skirmish yesterday. The Senate passed a bill permitting the sale of pre-colored margarine with no restrictions.

Butter wins in House. The House passed a bill permitting the sale of pre-colored margarine with no restrictions.

Both bills would permit use of margarine in state institutions, but require to serve butter, and

abolish the present state licensing taxes ranging from \$3 to \$500 on sellers of the product.

Each chamber is expected to re-pass the bills in a few days in an attempt to reach a compromise.

In No Mood To Yield. Judging from yesterday's debate in the House, many of the members are farmers and dairymen, the butter backers were in no mood for further yielding.

One of them, Rep. Benjamin Bartinger (R-New Milford) said the bill approved by the House already represented a fair compromise.

By eliminating margarine taxes and permitting use of the product in state institutions, he said, "the agricultural groups have come a long way from their traditional stand on oleo."

Margarine supporters were counting on support from the voters back home to obtain further concessions from the farm group.

"Battering for Butter" "Housewives" - Republicans, Democrats and Independents - are literally howling for relief from

the labor of coloring margarine, said Rep. Philip P. Lang (D-Windor), who led the unsuccessful fight in the House against the bill.

Both sides contended that big business interests were involved in the battle.

Rep. John P. Coster (D-Hartford), the House majority leader, said the issue was "not a contest between consumers and farmers," but one between "four or five large companies importing margarine from Asia and Africa, and a small group of farmers."

Rep. George C. Conroy (R-Guilford), the minority leader, contended on the other hand that "there must be a great lobby at work" for the color ban. And Long contended that farm opposition to removal of the color restriction resulted from "bugaboos and propaganda" from "the dairy interests tied up with midway but-ter combing."

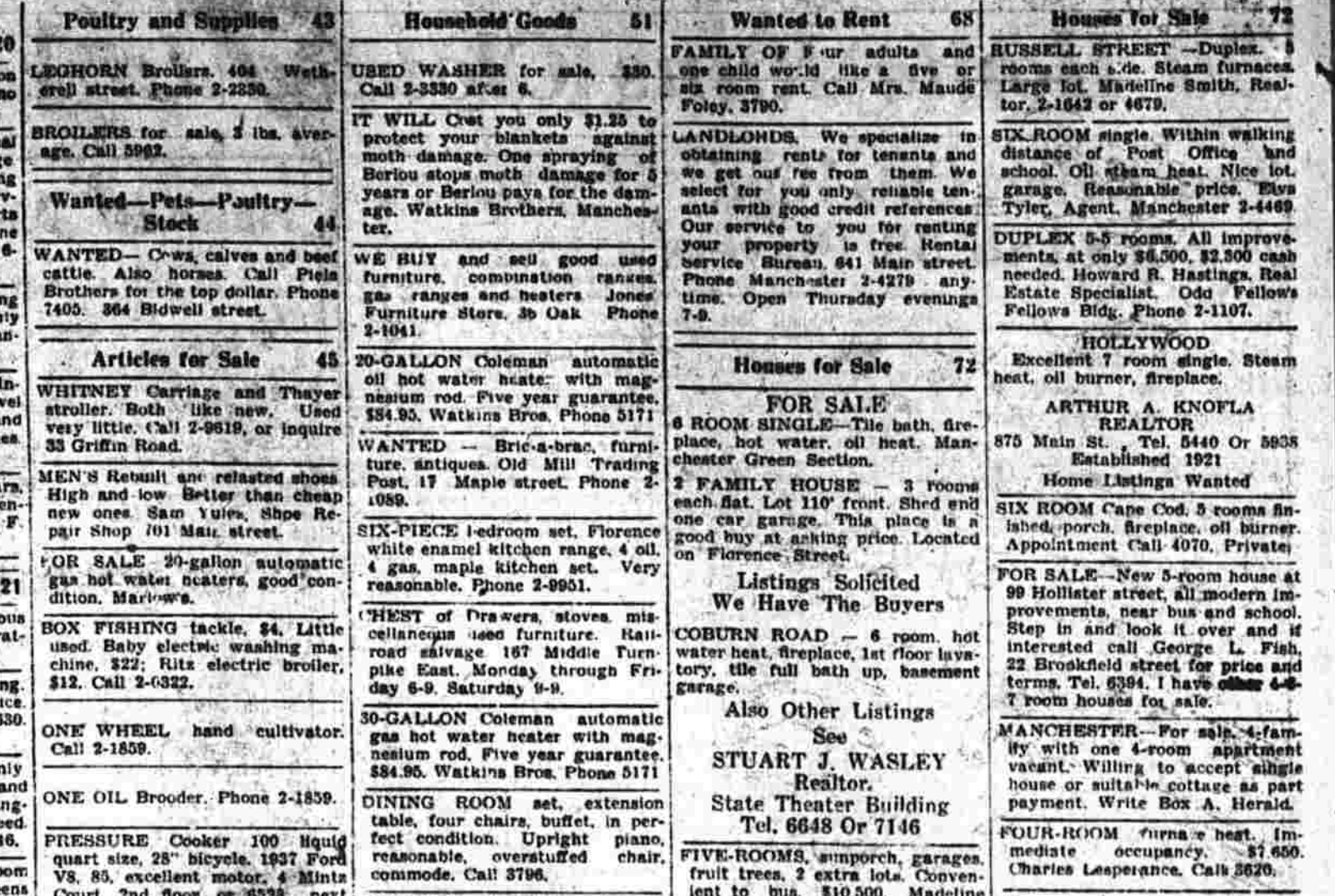

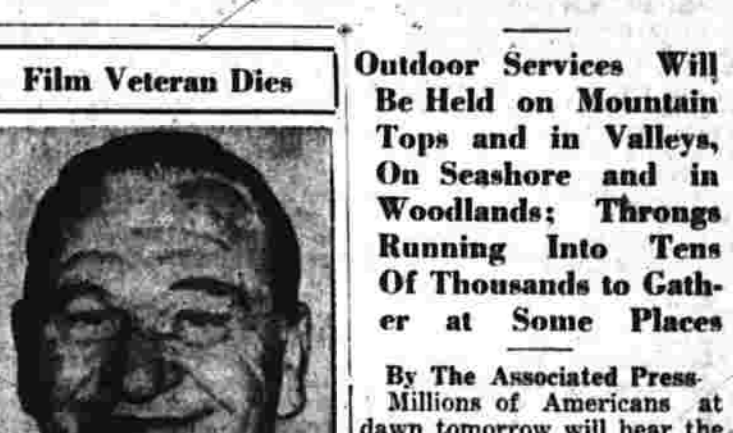
