**RECOVER SPURNS TROUBLE**  
 Ever since the war this country has realized some obligation to help Europe back to economic recovery. This obligation has been most spectacularly met by the Marshall Plan, which is now in high gear.

The ultimate ambition of the Marshall Plan and of other American loans and helps to Europe has been to make Europe self-sufficient again.

There is only one way this self-sufficiency can be obtained. That is for Europe to get into production and then to get into trade. When European production is good enough to provide Europe with enough things to sell, then the stage is set for Europe's independence of American financial subsidy or loan.

European recovery, to the point where Europe will no longer need our financial help is, then, the goal of our policy.

This recovery is now beginning to appear. And, the moment it appears, it will bring new trouble. That is the way of the complicated world of ours.

For the end phase of European recovery requires consumption somewhere of the production Europe is achieving.

And this is where business, in its normal course and in its normal philosophy, begins to wonder whether such recovery is good news after all.

At least one peace and war, is in dispute. And in back of that is the important truth that it is trade properly, or the lack of it, which may be the determining factor in mankind's continuing choice between peace and war.

Acceptance of the idea of freer world trade demands not only compromise, but drastic readjustments on the part of individual countries and individual industry.

There can be an effort to make this adjustment as painless as possible. But there cannot be any avoidance of the issue.

Here, with its reciprocal trade program of the peace time years, with its bold and imaginative inclusion in the original Lend-Lease contracts of an obligation for other nations to join us after the war in lowering international trade barriers, in our leadership in the discussions leading up to the drafting of the International Trade Charter at Havana last year, the United States has faithfully and persuasively pursued one of the roads toward the building of a lasting world peace.

It is perhaps the most fundamental of all roads to peace. Present awareness of the results of the European recovery we have been promoting means that the road is now entering its rocky stage.

Where its present discomforts and bruises and injuries must be measured realistically against the importance of the eventual goal.

**Embarrassing Issue**  
 Secretary of State Acheson, driving only for ratification of the North Atlantic Pact, but also for a vote by Congress to supply arms to the Pact members, is being given some anxious moments by the insistence of these members that they themselves shall be the judges of how the arms will be given and distributed, and shared among themselves.

Britain, France, the Netherlands, Belgium and Luxembourg have been arguing that, if the United States is merely one of a mutual association of nations, it has no more right than any other member to decide what use shall be made of its own contributions to the Pact. They maintain that we should hand over arms to them, as a group, and that they should then decide what shall be done with them.

Mr. Acheson is reported able to agree with them in principle, but not in political practice.
