What was this? Was it Senator Taft clearing the way for another try at the Presidency? Was it merely a cynical, tactical acceptance of eventualities? Senator Taft no longer thinks the nation can avoid it. It is even Senator Taft now saying, "Me too!"

We don't think it is as simple or as shallow as that. Senator Taft, an all America should know, is in this time, is a curious individual. He has been more spectacularly wrong than any purported leader of our time. His friends call it courage; his enemies call it a black, reactionary heart. He is very hard to educate. Out of his own wrongdoings.

But he can be educated. What has sometimes been described as the best mind of the nineteenth century is always picking along a little bit now and then.

Perhaps the important thing about Senator Taft is that when he does catch up, he is honest about it, and proceeds to do something about it. He has himself, of late, been giving more and more thought to the formulation of liberal legislation such as he is now telling his party it must support, if it wishes to live. He knows that the Republican caucus the other day ranged him along side Governor Dewey, in the latter election post mortem.

Senator Taft himself at long last in some tune with the platform his party has been adopting in recent campaigns—plans for a new kind of liberalism, a liberalism recognized by the record of which Senator Taft himself had been leading the party in Congress.

Now he himself is telling his party that the era of blind orthodoxy is over. He is saying, "I do not wish to be on the way, the same general cause the Democrats favor, reserving the right to pursue these aims in its own more conservative manner, but working for them, instead of against them. And the Republican liberals, who have known all this all along and who have had to fight Taft himself again and again, are pinching themselves to make sure they awake, and this time they will be helped by the new Taft produce. He could certainly help in the process of giving the party a record in the years of 1948. We do not think that his death would be help, instead of a damnation in 1952.

Senator Taft himself at long last in some tune with the platform his party has been adopting in recent campaigns—plans for a new kind of liberalism, a liberalism recognized by the record of which Senator Taft himself had been leading the party in Congress.

Now he himself is telling his party that the era of blind orthodoxy is over. He is saying, "I do not wish to be on the way, the same general cause the Democrats favor, reserving the right to pursue these aims in its own more conservative manner, but working for them, instead of against them. And the Republican liberals, who have known all this all along and who have had to fight Taft himself again and again, are pinching themselves to make sure they awake, and this time they will be helped by the new Taft produce. He could certainly help in the process of giving the party a record in the years of 1948. We do not think that his death would be help, instead of a damnation in 1952.

**Letting Fate Make Peace**

Lieut. Gen. Rodell Smith, recently back from his duties as an ambassador at Moscow, talks to the Herald about the Russian situation and the health of Stalin. He expects him to "live for a long time."

It is a good thing, we think, that General Smith has stated his opinion. It would also be a good thing if the western world would proceed on the basis that his observation and prediction are likely to be accurate.

For since the rumors of Stalin's ill health started, the western world has been living in a weak and shadowy hope. It has been toying with the idea that the cold war could be won, and the issues dividing Russia and the rest of the world dissolved, by the mortality of one human individual.

This cheap way of ending our difficulties with Russia received its greatest notoriety when it came into the Boston speech of that sometimes great statesman, Winston Churchill, who chose to make the death of Stalin the only tangible prospect of world peace.

There is not likely to be any such easy answer to our present difficulties. Even if Stalin should die, as he will some day, the chance that his death might really make a change in Russia's relations with the world is altogether too slight for use in any serious calculation of policy.

What the western world is doing, then, every time it turns to the death of Stalin as the answer to its troubles, is avoiding the responsibility of really facing the problem of relations with Russia. In so far as death is considered our ally, we tend to shape our policy into a game of waiting for our ally to do his worst. It is an inviting lullaby of thought and policy that appears before us. We don't have to make up our own minds what must be done to bring peace; it will be done for us. We don't have to examine the issues between ourselves and Russia, looking for an honest solution; the thing will solve itself. Why bother wondering where we are right and where we ourselves might be wrong when, right or wrong, victory is to be delivered to us?

This is dangerous business, especially when one can be fairly sure that there will be no peace until signs have thought more seriously about what its real ingredients must be.

The very first essential of any progress toward peace is for both sides to begin to think their way out of the hysterical fear they have of one another today—a fear which reaches its most ridiculous proportions when a great statesman of the West can publicly infer that the death of the leader of the East would be a blessing.

Let us not depend upon some gift from fate for the making of peace. Let us depend upon our own honesty, our own tolerance, our own ability to grow in statesmanship.
