In colonial days in America, the
adustrial revolution saw factories developing and the moving of such trades as weaving and tailoring from homes into factories. The early industrial plants found man-agement guilty of many abuses, continued Mr. Furey, such as 12hour working days, the employ-ment of young children and unsan-itary working conditions. In 1792, shoemakers organized ollowed in 1794 by typesetters.

The term "collective bargaining" was first used in 1799. The early unions were short-lived. About 1830, employers began to organize to dictate working hours and produce black lists and labor spies. The National Labor union, formed after the Civil War, lasted only six years as employers launched ign of terror including murder. fostered political action t force members to desert.

The American Federation Labor was formed in 1886 with a backbone of carpenter. iron and cigar workers. Railway Brotherand Independent Workers of the world also came into promi-nence at this time, stated Mr. Furey. The Congress of Industrial Organization brought new ideas, such as the open shop, sit-down strikes and "yellow dog" contracts. Many of these tactics were outlawed with the passage of time. lime-study men brought an added train to employer-worker rela-



Low Water Pressure Reported at Hospital

Serious deficiencies in Manchester's fire-fighting water distribution systém were pointed up last night. Raymond W. Goslee, appearing before the Board of Directors on a proposal to improve water pressure and volume at Memorial Hospital stated that tests last week show that there is no adequate emergency fire-fighting protection for the structure. The directors, impressed by the condition decided to meet next Tuesday to take remedial steps.

While the hospital situation appeared the most compelling from last night's discussion, it was revealed that water mains in many other places are too small, and that firemen would face a water lack in the case of a large configuration in many other parts of town.
