Rotary Hears Labor History

Guest Speaker Traces Growth of Movement From Early Days

Willard H. Pury, personal director of Bigelow-Stanford Rug Co. in Thompsonville, addressed Rotarians on "Growth of Labor Relations" at their meeting held last night at the Sheraton restaurant. W. Harris Hartford, manager of Bigelow-Stanford, was a guest of the club.

Later, as skilled craftsmen came along and fitted one skill or trade against another, unions began to form when master craftsmen joined to prevent journeymen or apprentices from entering into their trades. At this time, in early England, the battle of labor and capital began.

In colonial days in America, the industrial revolution was developing and the moving of such trades as weaving and tailoring from homes into factories. The early industrial plants found management guilty of many abuses.

In 1792, shoemakers organized, followed in 1794 by typographers. The term "collective bargaining" was first used in 1796. The early unions were short-lived. About 1830, employers began to organize to dictate working hours and produce black lists and labor spies.

The National Labor union, formed after the Civil War, lasted only six years as employers launched a reign of terror including murder and fostered political action to force members to desert.

The American Federation of Labor was formed in 1886 with a backbone of carpenter, iron and cigar workers. Railway Brotherhood and Independent Workers of the world also came into prominence at this time, stated Mr. Pury.

Today finds a constant growth of mutual understanding by both management and labor, concluded the speaker. No one ever wins a war or a strike, he said, by keeping his hands on a gun.

A lively discussion followed the talk.

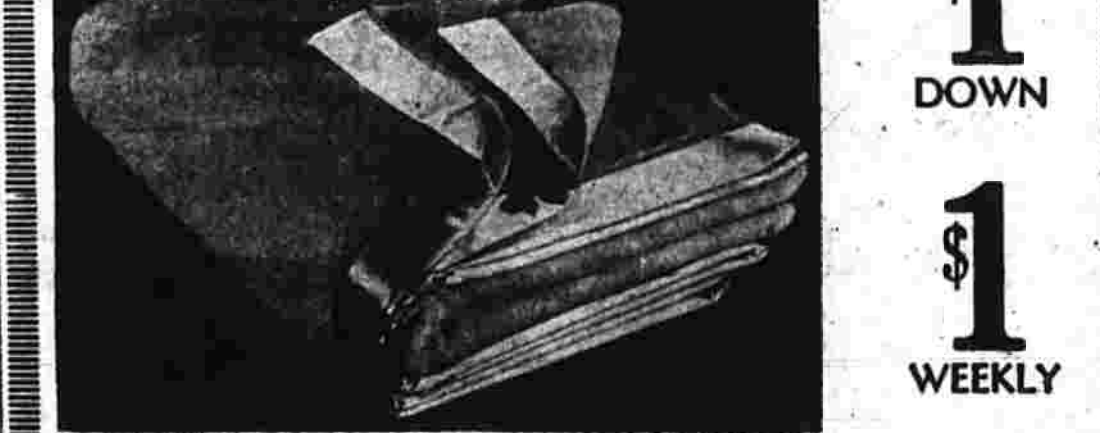

Low Water Pressure Reported at Hospital

Results of Fire Tests Reported to Directors; Protection at Institute Is Seen Inadequate

Serious deficiencies in Manchester's fire-fighting water distribution system were pointed out last night by Raymond W. Goslee, appearing before the Board of Directors on a proposal to improve water pressure and volume at Memorial Hospital.

While the hospital situation appeared the most compelling from last night's discussion, it was revealed that water mains in many other places are too small, and that firemen would face a water shortage in the case of a large conflagration in many other parts of town.

Commenting on the hospital, Mr. Goslee pointed out that the trustees are planning to install a four-foot additional water main which will add to present water needs.

Mr. Goslee, plant engineer of Cheney Brothers, noted that he had read through the proposal furnished the town regarding the improvement of its water system, and he warned that the town's water mains have perhaps over the years had efficiency of 40 per cent.

The directors voted to study the problem, but that they are not official and have not been filed with the town clerk. They are aware already of the way through the way where water supply seems to be inadequate.

The directors also considered several sewage matters. One is the long standing problem of the Ashmun street sanitary sewer. The town is considering a fire district matter, but they are not official and have not been filed with the town clerk.

The Board voted to instruct a general meeting to consult with town counsel to see what may be done toward setting up an apartment house in cases where undeveloped property is concerned.

It was stated that the North of the 8th District charge is \$100 per hydrant plus a quarter of a foot inch. The commissioners noted that they are perfectly satisfied with the consideration given the district of the administration of new construction and installations which are proposed.

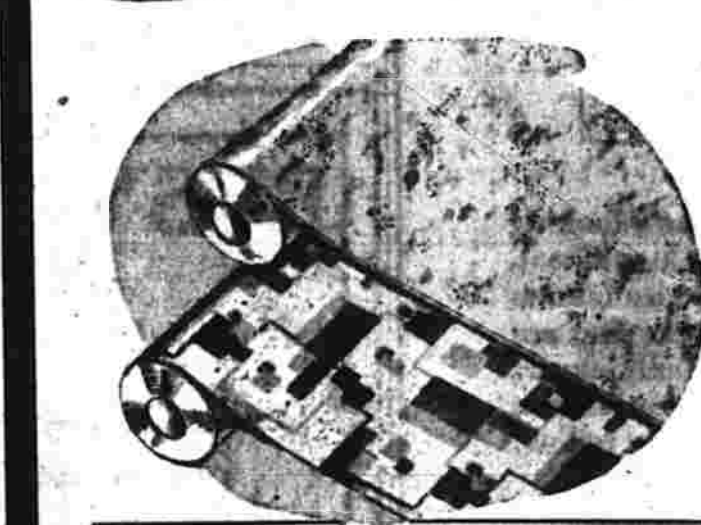

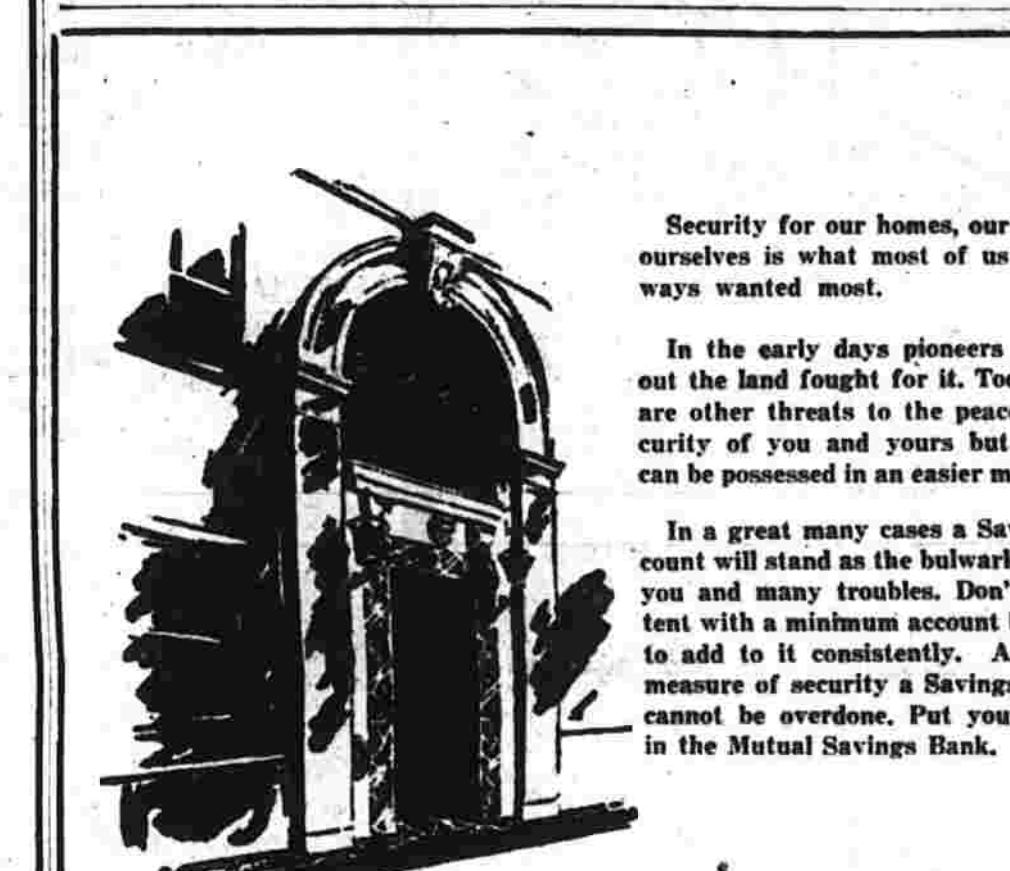
