Price Change, Not Ordinary: The average American is beginning to get the idea that one of the best "deflation" or "recession" or "leveling off" or whatever other pleasant name it may be called, is a little deeper, a little more serious than it is supposed to be.

What gives him that idea is the way government and business and financial leaders are talking to the public in order to proclaim that an upturn is just around the corner.

His reasons, with some memory of 1929, that if an upturn were really just around the corner, most of these leaders would be so busy getting ready that they wouldn't have time to be talking about it. He thinks these leaders wouldn't be spouting public optimism if they weren't privately worried. In other words, the fact that these statements are being made is in itself an ominous sign.

When prices reach the level at which a resumption of public purchasing seems sensible and advantageous to the public, within the capacity of its pocketbook, the period of downward adjustment will end, and the volume of production and sales will go up again.

How long this process takes depends, largely, on whether American business cooperates with it or fights against it. Price cuts will do more than craters can to bring the period of adjustment to an end. As to what kind of price cuts they should be, two manufacturing firms quoted in the financial pages the other day had the right idea. They said they had decided not to try to ease the situation along with a series of price reduction nibbles. They figured their situation out, and announced one price cut—a big one.

You'll notice, in the Herald advertisements, that Manchester retailers are, in many instances, really slashing prices, not merely toying with them. That makes it common sense to buy in the one and only thing which will reverse the downward trend.

How Can It Be? President Truman yesterday said his press conference that he believed the Russians were "acting in good faith" in their proposal for the lifting of the Berlin blockade. If he did believe that, he said, nothing would be happening on the Russian proposal—as it is happening.

President Truman, we are sure, did not realize how shocking anything like "good faith" in the Russian might be. But the fact is that for three years of cold war the official policy of Washington, frequently expressed by the President and scores of Undersecretaries, has been that the Russians are completely untrustworthy people, lost to international honor, who never say what they mean or mean what they say, and who can only be safely handled, therefore, by a cold ignoring of anything they say.

Now the great world villain has suddenly, in a twist of the Presidential tongue, become capable of something called "good faith." The President believes something Russia says. How can it be? Well, the first taste of it is shocking, but the answer is, of course, that we are on our way back from the sometimes hysterical extremes which have been the propaganda aspect of the cold war. We are beginning the long way back toward regarding the Russians as people, rather than as villains, toward regarding the policy of Russia as something natural and inevitable rather than as any malevolently contrived villainy.

The Russians haven't really changed, and we haven't really changed, and the real issues between us are the same old quiet as serious as they ever were. But the business of trying to wage these issues by painting each other completely black is perhaps on the wane.

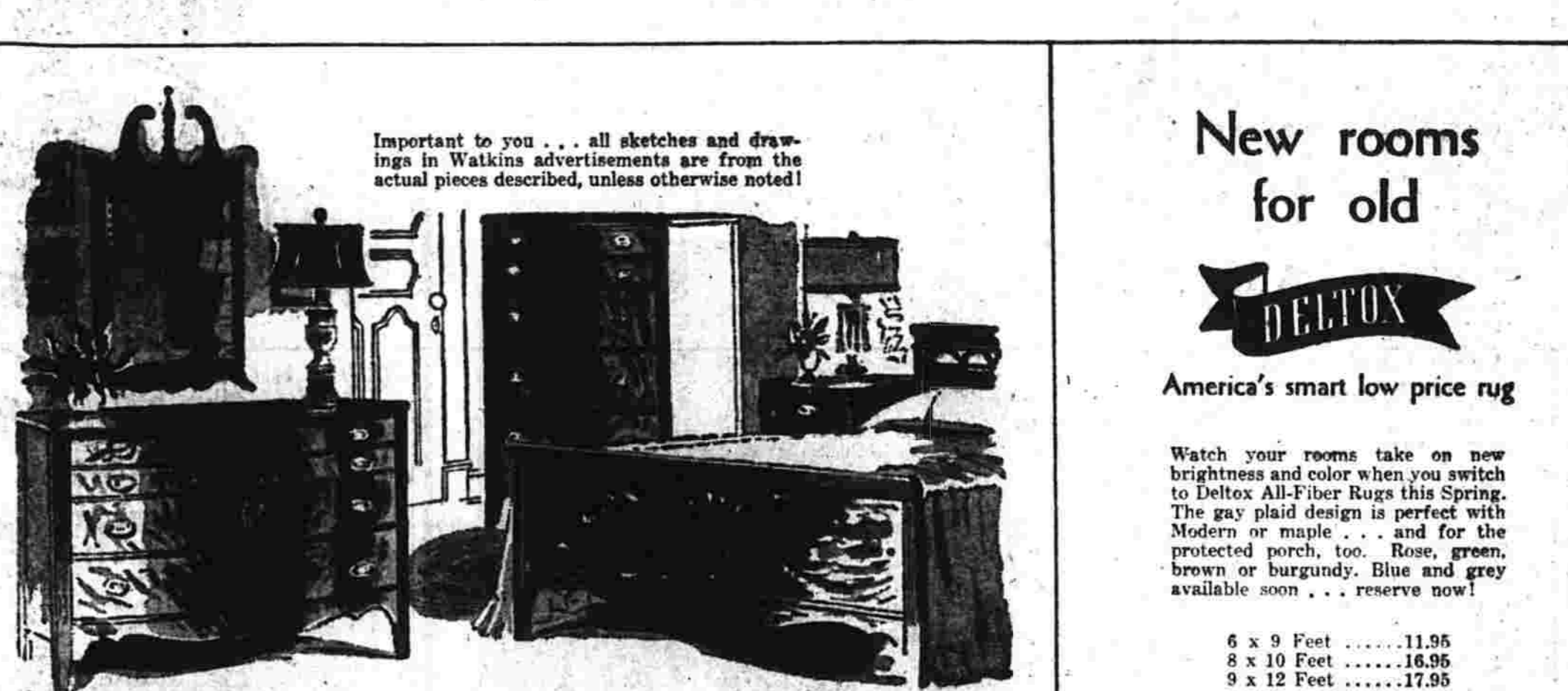

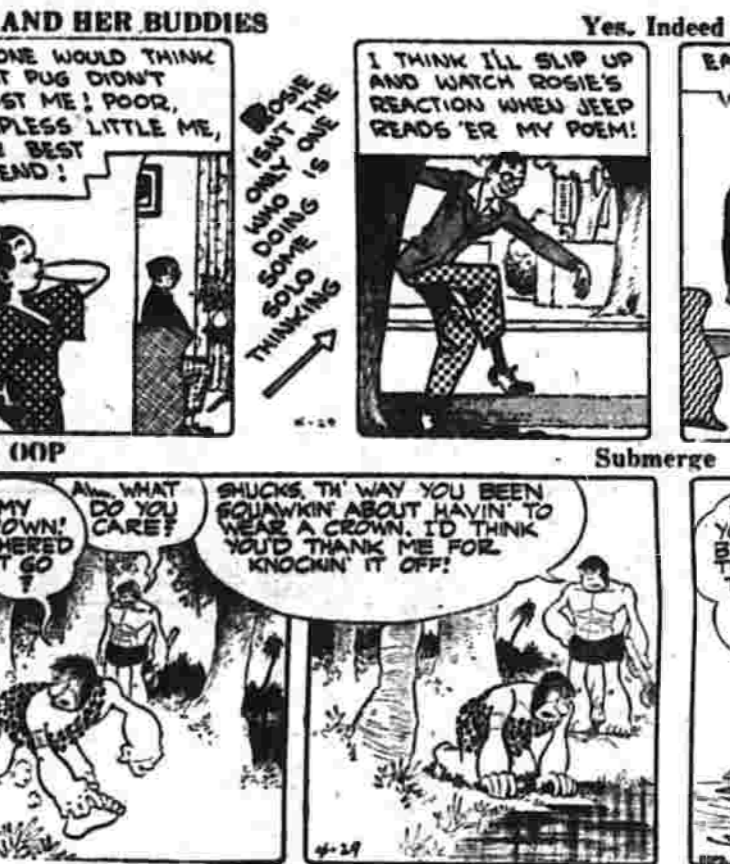
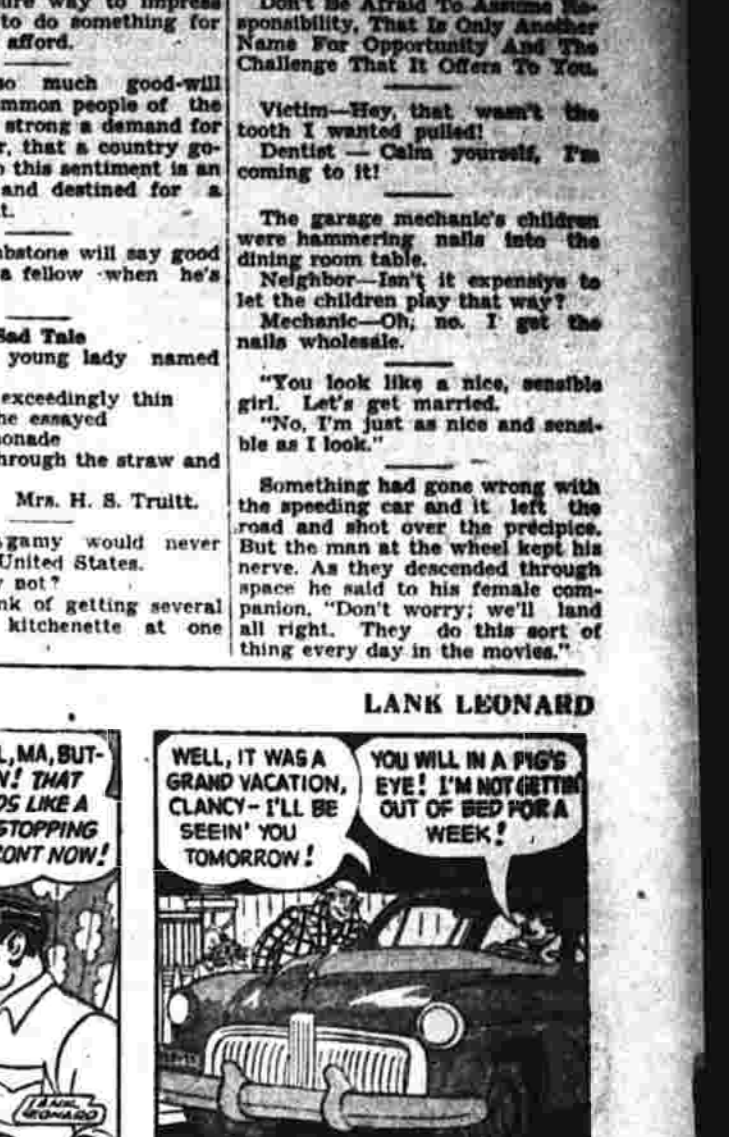
