



Manchester Visiting Nurses - - -

Acclaimed By Thousands Of Manchester Families For Their Services



The Annual Drive For Funds Will Be Conducted During The Month Of May!

This organization has often been asked for more detailed information than is contained in the annual appeal, concerning its set-up and function in the town. Therefore, in asking the people of Manchester to contribute to this cause, we submit the following question

Q. What is the purpose of the Manchester Public Health Nursing Association? A. To provide nursing services when hospitalization is not indicated, and also health supervision in the homes of Manchester citizezns.

Q. How is the organization run? A. The Board is composed of a group of 19 women, who work on a volunteer basis. They are assisted by a volunteer business advisory board of 6 members. In addition there is a medical advisory board composed of 3

How many workers are employed? A. Five full time registered nurses, and one secretary.

Q. Is there a charge for a nursing visit? A. Yes. Full pay \$1.25. If patients cannot afford to pay the full amount, any fee is accepted. If patients cannot pay any amount, a free visit is made. Q. Are the services available to everyone. A. Yes. As we have said each year in our appeal, our visiting nurse service is available to

all residents of Manchester, regardless of economic status. Q. How can a nurse be reached? A. By calling the Public Health Nursing Association at 71 Haynes street, Telephone 3426- be-

tween the hours of 8 a. m. and 4:30 p. m. Q. Can a nurse be called at any hour, day or night? A. The nurses work an 8 hour day from 8 a. m. to 4 p. m., but in a case of emergency, a nurse will respond after the regular hours. In an emergency after hours, call The Manchester Memorial Hospital

Q. What kind of nursing care are the nurses asked to give most often? A. Any kind of bedside care prescribed by the family doctor, such as a bed bath, enema, hypodermic, change of dressing for a surgical case, and care of chronic invalids. Help and advice to

young mothers on the care of their babies is another service of the nurses. Supervision—The nurses go into homes where they check babies, advise concerning inoculations, give pre-natal supervision and check tubercular patients. The visits are made once a month. Patients are referred by the Board of Health, Manchester doctors, Hartford doctors, Hartford clinics, and our own clinics.

Q. How many visits were made to homes during the past year? A. 9724.

O. What clinics are held? 1. Mental Hygiene Clinic-Held all day every Monday at The Clinic rooms which are in the basement of the hospital-by appointment only. Last year there were 301 who attended.

2. Tonsil and Adenoid Clinic-every Tuesday 9 a. m .- clinic rooms-63 attended. 3. Pre-natal Clinio-every Thursday 9 a. m. clinic rooms-63 attended.

4. Chest Clinic every Friday 9 a. m. clinic rooms by appointment only—441 attended.
5. Tumor Clinic every second Monday and fourth Wednesday clinic rooms, by appointment only.

6. Well Baby Clinic-every Friday from 2-4 p. m. clinic rooms-every Wednesday 2-4 p. m. at the Y. M. C. A .- 291 babies attended. A Toxoid and Vaccination clinic is held once a year before school starts-37 attended last year.
