Bradley Declares Heart of Europe Is Defense Line

Washington, May 3.—(AP)—Gen. Omar N. Bradley told senators today that America's defense frontiers lie in the heart of Europe.

The Army chief of staff was before the Senate Foreign Relations committee to urge approval of the 12-nation North Atlantic security alliance.

"Geographically," he said, "many of these members are already in position where any aggression into western Europe would be countered by these homelands."

"I believe you that our frontiers of collective defense are coming with their in the heart of Europe."

Bradley backed the administration's plan for \$1,100,000,000 for the past year. Under questioning from Sen. Donald H. Riegle, he said the money would be spent in shape and ship to Europe military equipment over from the war.

He also acknowledged that the original cost of the equipment was several times greater than the \$1,100,000,000 figure administration officials have used in spending of the program.
