Church Holds Family Life

Families Gather to Sipp, See Movies and Listen To Lectures

"The American Family" was the theme at South Church last night for the Family Night Program highlighting the observance of National Family Week, May 1-8.

During the first part of the evening the families met together for a community sing, after which the movie, "The House I Live In," featuring Frank Sinatra, was shown. The movie embraced the idea that all Americans are brothers regardless of race or religion.

At this point, Rev. Fred Hagden, pastor of South Church, introduced the speakers of the evening. Dr. James H. Barnett, head of the Sociology Department of the University of Connecticut, and Rev. and Mrs. Garland Waggoner of the Storry Congregational church.

"Problems of Family Life," Dr. Barnett spoke to the adults in the chapel on "Problems of Family Life." He explained at the outset that the family is the primary group to which every one belongs. Most people, however, during their lifetime belong to two family groups, the one into which they are born and the one of which they become a part after marriage.

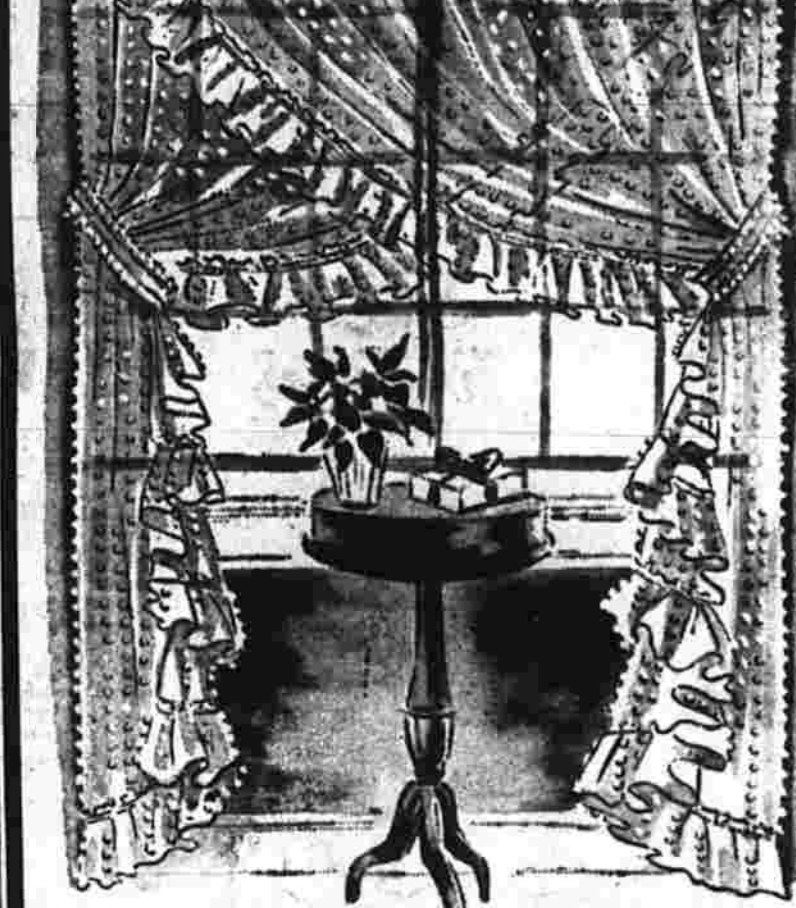

The General Manager reported that on Friday, April 29, 1949, while he was in the process of making arrangements to reschedule the Town of Manchester, Connecticut, 1.50 per cent School Bonds, dated May 1, 1949, at a higher rate of interest, he received from George R. Waldmann of the Mercantile Bank of New York, New York Office of the Mercantile Bank and Trust Company of St. Louis, as agent for the group of bankers consisting of Mercantile Bank of New York, N. Y., R. S. Dickson & Company, Incorporated of New York, N. Y., Wood Gundy & Company, Incorporated of New York, N. Y., and Rand & Company of New York, N. Y., an offer to purchase said bonds as described in the notice of sale dated April 18, 1949, at par and accrued interest. He stated that it was necessary to set up the offer promptly and that since no bids had been received at the public sale for said bonds, he accepted the offer for said bonds.

Highlights of Discussion: In discussing the motion, Director Raymond E. Hagdorn noted that he had opposed the amount of the bond issue, which he said was evidently some \$200,000 more than appears necessary for the carrying out of the current part of the school building program. He said that he is still opposed to financing arrangements which seem to be in excess of the current need.

General Manager Waddell and other members of the Board pointed out that the schools are not yet completed and that alterations and additions to estimates are continuing in many details. The general manager noted that

some \$8,000 in additional work has so far been found necessary on the basement of the Princeton street school. The present apparent laundry he felt, might be whitened down considerably if structural difficulties were encountered.

Hagdorn said he wished to make it clear that he is not opposed to the school bond issue, but that, as he saw it, the sum which may be left over is quite substantial, and that the estimates seemed too high.

Can Use Surplus Fund: It was stated that any surplus would go into the capital projects fund and might be used for such purposes as more school structures.

Washington, May 3.—(AP)—Senator Vandenberg (R., Mich.), rebuked Henry Wallace to his face today in the Senate for insisting that "that our country is imperialistic in attitude and objectives."

Wallace, former president and cabinet officer, was testifying to the Senate Foreign Relations committee in opposition to the North Atlantic security alliance.

Under his amendment, the money granted to the states would be available to children in private and parochial schools as well as public schools.

McMahon said the Supreme court has held that the proposed aid might be used for non-public schools—despite its ruling that Federal taxes cannot be used to support any religious activities or institutions.

Vandenberg made this statement after Vandenberg (D., Wis.) had asked Wallace if he wants this country to "sit down and let Russia shove us around and do nothing about it."

Big Four Agreement Sets Berlin Blockade Lifting for May 12
