Washington, May 3.—(AP)—Senator Vandenberg (R., Mich.), rebuked Henry Wallace to his face today in the Senate for his stand on the Atlantic pact.

Under his amendment, the money granted to the states would be available to children in private and parochial schools as well as public schools.

Wallace, former president and cabinet officer, was testifying to the Senate Foreign Relations committee in opposition to the North Atlantic security alliance.

The western powers' counter-blockade of the Soviet zone of Germany will be ended at the same time.

The Council of Foreign Ministers will meet in Paris May 12 to consider questions relating to Germany, and questions of currency in Berlin.

The four power communique, checking more than two months of the Soviet display of hostility, was issued simultaneously in Moscow, London, Paris and Washington.

**The Dollar Dilemma**
