His company assumed that the talks would be continued until the strike on the Chrysler plant was brought to a close.

He declined to accompany Ford from Detroit, however.

Ford said he would neither appear personally at the negotiations nor would he engage in a public debate with Reuther in the dispute which was settled by Friday.

War Hero's Return

Remains of Lieutenant William L. Anderson who died in air action in the South Pacific in September 1943, will arrive on the 10:30 train Thursday evening at the Manchester railroad station, according to a telegram received today by the funeral director, Mark Holmes.

The son of Mrs. Frank Bromley and a native of Manchester, he enlisted with the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1942 and received his basic and advanced pilot's training at fields in Quebec and Ontario. Upon his graduation as a fighter pilot, he applied for admission to the U. S. Air Force and was accepted. After advanced training in Louisiana, he was sent to the South Pacific, and joined the 5th Air Force, after which he took part in 70 separate fighter missions in several South Pacific areas. He was cited by his commander for gallantry in action on several occasions involving the rescue of downed flyers.

Anderson was killed in action on September 30, 1944, while leading a formation of fighters in an attack on a Japanese base. His remains were recovered by the U. S. Air Force and are being held at the Home National Cemetery, 409 Main street, Manchester.
