position that if Russia wants peace in Greece she should stop her Communist activities from behind the guerrillas. The U. S. also told Russia that American aid will continue until the satellite aid is refused.

Britain has taken a similar view, saying she is unable to negotiate for peace in Greece "behind the back of the Greek government." Both the U. S. and Britain have stressed the mediation role of the United Nations in the three-year-old civil war, but Russia has boycotted such efforts.

Top military authorities in Athens are convinced the guerrillas, whose strength is believed reduced to 20,000, can be defeated this year. American aid amounting to \$675,000,000 and military training by U. S. military advisers have strengthened the government forces in the fight.
