Connecticut Yankee

An antidote for whatever public criticism there has been of the political character of its own appointments, and as a general measure for curbing any far-sweeping Republican prestige which might possibly come out of the present session of the General Assembly, the Bowles administration is now beginning to focus its attention on the record of Republican office holders.

The first arrow loomed from the Bowles quiver, which we expect to be rather amply supplied, was the firing of the signal which torpedoed the Navy's giant carrier, also shot down a whole group of plane manufacturers.

This week's issue of "United States News" carries two separate articles concerning Mr. Johnson—printed separately but obviously intended to be read together.

One article tells the story of how it was Mr. Johnson who in 1945, as Secretary of State, was the one who held the reins of the German problem, the Russians have begun, at least, with a promise and ostensible demand that all the Conference should accomplish a return to the conditions which existed before both sides began breaking up the Potsdam agreement.

It is still theoretically possible to argue that we were the ones who first violated the Potsdam agreement, and that therefore there is some moral obligation upon us as well as upon Russia to go back to the original agreement for the Communist-Germany's affairs. But this would be idle theory; too much action has passed into the record; the only solution of the German problem or of the problem of United States-Russian relations is to go forward, not back. The past can not be unwritten; nor can the bridge be built so long as the diplomacy of any great power remains wedded to that past.

Russia's first proposal at Paris has been unexpectedly surrendered to us the propaganda advantage of the Conference. We went to the Conference with the intention of making a name for ourselves in the clarity and hopefulness of its recommendations for the future. So far, at least, Russia has not lived up to the promise of both sides for a return to conditions existing before the blockade was first imposed. The Russians assumed, and there is no reason to doubt their sincerity in this, for it represented one of the main reasons why they lifted the blockade at all, that this agreement meant that we, on our side, abandon the restrictions on trade between the East-West zones of Germany, restrictions which we had imposed in the course of the battle over Berlin, which finally had up to the blockade itself, we have refused to lift these restrictions as yet, and our refusal has been followed by Russian measures which amount to a partial re-institution of the blockade itself.

In this situation, each side is accusing the other of violating the New York Agreement. But it appears to be one instance in which the Russians made the mistakes of which American diplomats have so often been accused—the mistake of not insisting that every last detail of an agreement be spelled out. There have been times, in our dealing with Russia, when we have not got what we thought we were getting, and have found out that, strictly speaking, what we expected had never legally been promised.
