Rockville Special City Meet Tonight

Rockville Officials Call Session to Act on Extra Appropriations

Rockville, June 14—(Special)—A special city meeting has been called for this evening at eight o'clock at the Town Hall to act upon the recommendations of the Common Council. Extra appropriations totaling \$2,647.24 are being asked, to include \$547.24 for attorney fees paid to Plank and Lugg for legal services rendered in the action of the Marx Realty Corporation against the City of Rockville; \$1,600 for salary, supplies and equipment for the Building Inspector and \$500 additional salaries for the City Clerk.

At the time the original budget was adopted, Rockville did not have a Building Inspector. The added amount for the City Clerk is because the salaries of the judge, prosecutor and clerk have been increased by act of the General Assembly and the present budget does not allow for these increases.

At the adjourned city meeting action will be taken upon the tax rate of 16 mills as recommended by the city council, a deduction of two mills over 1948. This reduction is possible in spite of the fact that the city has paid \$3,000 toward a snow loader, purchased two new trucks and a gravel spreader for the Public Works Department and a cruiser for the Police Department. The usual five per cent discount is being recommended for those who pay their taxes early.
