Gordon Hunter told members of the Rotary club last night. Col. Hunter, who is vice president and agency manager of the Phoenix Mutual Life Insurance Company of Hartford, was a recent guest of Secretary of Defense Johnson.

Notables from Army and civil life were also invited by Secretary Johnson to view the current hational defense system, said the speaker, who for several years commanded the 189th Infantry, d3rd Division of the Connecticut National Guard.

At a proving ground in Fidelia, said the colonel, Secretary Johnson showed his guests the fastest and largest planes in the world, and in Georgia the Army uncovered their latest weapons and demonstrated how they operate under all sorts of conditions.

Increased Efficiency
Then came a mass parachute jump that saw the paratroopers followed to the ground by tanks and light artillery. Col. Hunter added that this nation's defense leaders are devoting their lives to increasing the efficiency of the defense system.

In discussing Russia, Col. Hunter add that country understands only unquestioned strength and he predicted that the Atlantic Pact will have to be implemented with arms. The 13 men in the Kremlin are hoping that the U. S. will fall into a depression, he said.

Ahead in Production

Asserting that the Marshail Plan and Atlantic Fact are making themselves felt, Col. Hunter concluded that Russia cannot hope to beat the nations lined up against her because their production is far ahead of anything she can produce.
