



The new bill, whipped into shape yesterday by a House Agriculture subcommittee, would repeal outright the 1948 law due to set up a flexible price support system at 60 to 90 per cent of parity, starting next year.

Instead, it would adopt a new parity system proposed by Secretary of Agriculture Brannan, and set price supports at 100 per cent engaged in esplonage activity.

take pledges for blood to be donated when the state-wide Blood Program begins This Blood Program will mean a constant supply of blood available at all times to all Connecticut residents. Manchester's quota is 1100 pints a year. To achieve this goal 3000 pledges are needed so that no one will be asked to contribute too

Volunteer workers will call on you June 20 or 21. Please receive them graciously

and let them explain the workings of the Blood Program to you. They will

Blood will be free of charge to all with only a payment to the patient's hospital for the actual transusion costs. Blue Cross and most other hospitalization insurance will cover this transfusion charge. Blood will no longer be a staggering expense for patients needing several pints.

Anyone between the ages of 18 and 60 in good physical condition may give blood. (Parents' permission is required for unmarried persons between the ages of 18 and 21.) Solicitors will explain health requirements and doctors will pass on ability to give blood at the time of the Blood-Mobile visits.

The Blood-Mobile Unit will come to the Armory 10 times a year. Appointments will

be made three weeks ahead of time by calling donors who have filled out pledge

cards. Those who pledge now will not be asked for donations until fall and many will not be asked for several months. Blood must be available for emergency use at all times. The only way we can be sure of a sufficient supply for our protection in time of a disaster such as the Hartford Circus fire is to have a regular system of collecting blood and storing it for

Traffic accidents daily send victims to the hospital needing emergency transfusions. Operations become much safer and convalescence much speedier when whole blood can be used freely.

Blood collected and not used immediately will never be wasted for it will be processed into many blood products which will also be given out free of charge.
