Yale Confers Honor Degrees
Award Decorates to General Clay and to John J. McCloy

New Haven, June 21.—Yale University conferred honorary degrees today upon General Louis D. Clay, of Berlin "air lift" fame, and John J. McCloy, its civilian successor, as the U. S. official in Berlin.

The two men, both made Doctors of Laws, were among 11 awarded honorary degrees at Yale's 248th commencement exercises. Other degrees were awarded as follows:

Other Degrees Awarded: Doctor of Laws—Stanford D. Gifford, president of the American University in Beirut, Syria.

Doctors of Humane Letters—Erwin D. Canham, editor of the Christian Science Monitor, and Carl Furutogawa, author of "The American People's Choice" and retired professor to Yale.

Doctor of Divinity—Samuel Eliot Morison, professor of history at Harvard University and an authority on American history and Christopher Columbus.

Doctor of Divinity—The Rt. Rev. Norman Burdett Nash, bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts, and former rector of St. Paul's school, Concord, N. H.

Manchester Legislators
 To their credit, Manchester's members of the 1949 Legislature remained generally untroubled by the usual careering and paralysis of reasonable thought which has distinguished the session in general.

Senator Charles R. House, his party's leader in the Senate, set a constructive keynote for his own party very early in the session when he delivered his so-called "areas of agreement" speech in which he set forth the possibilities of cooperation between the Republican legislators and Democratic Governor Bowers. Some elements of his own party, at that time, were more concerned with halting Governor Bowers than in cooperating with him, and their attitude played its part in creating the note of final quarrel which the session ended. But Senator House never descended to the level of political warfare for political sake. Before the break between the two parties came, he was instrumental in putting the evulsion law in proper form, and in bringing about the compromise on the issue of reorganization—two of the few things upon which Governor and Legislature finally agreed in what might have been, and should have been, their relationship throughout the session.

In these and in other instances, Senator House's counsels within his own party were on the side of moderation. 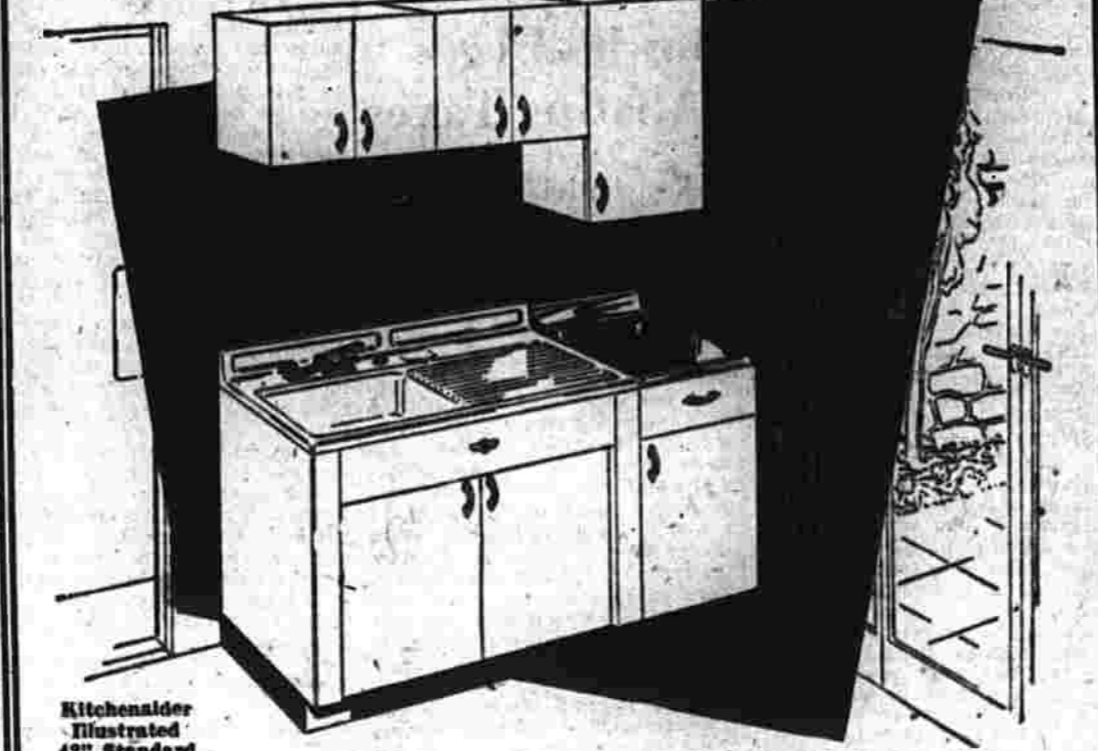

New York, June 22.—(AP)—U. S. Supreme Court Justice Felix Frankfurter testified today at the perjury trial of Alger Hiss that Hiss' reputation is "excellent." Asked by Defense Counsel Paul Stryker about Hiss' reputation for loyalty to his government, integrity and veracity, Frankfurter replied: "I never heard it called into question."

Added to describe Hiss' reputation, Frankfurter answered: "I would say it is excellent." The Supreme court justice appeared as the 11th defense witness in the perjury trial of Alger Hiss, State department official who admitted secret department papers transmission to a Soviet spy ring.

Frankfurter testified that he recommended Hiss for the post of law clerk to the late Justice Oliver Wendell Holmes in the spring of 1929 when Hiss was in his last year at Harvard law school.

"I decided Mr. Hiss was the man I could most confidently recommend to Justice Holmes," Frankfurter said.
