**Connecticut Yankee**

The life of a political neutral is not a happy one, as Carter Atkins, executive director of the Connecticut Public Expenditure Control, keeps discovering, again and again.

Not only is it unhappy, but it is difficult. And sometimes it is downright painful. It requires some extra counterbalancing.

It was counterbalancing which Mr. Atkins was trying to gain, when he judged, in his hand statement, that the next war will begin with the atomic bomb instead of with it. It is this threatened release into those very corners of the world which our minds know to be fatal, but which our practical minds find it difficult to resist, which calls for every last ounce of financial courage which resides in his many eyes where, for unless we do, the war will be a long and a painful one.

And yet, as we look again, and perhaps forever, and perhaps for the last time, we realize the danger and fight against it.

Echoes of long-past political maneuverings come to mind as one views the shenanigans currently being perpetrated by the Legislature. The Legislature is the capital of the Connecticut state government.

Even as the Romans when engaged in putting over some particularly reprehensible legislation would try to distract the popular mind by the offering of a public show, the Connecticut Legislature has been putting on a free circus for several weeks past. The Legislature, however, seems to be the Assembly members have been performing a variety of theatrical stunts to attract attention and to keep the public mind from focusing on the real issues.

Perhaps we are only getting what we deserve in the way of representation when we do not make our wishes known by letting our representatives know what we think. The interest in political matters which rises to a fever pitch at election time has not been so rapid as our legislators often feel. Unless the House returns to vote a compromise proposal.

In connection with the school building funds it would seem that the Legislature is suffering somewhat from a split personality devolving from its different roles in Massachusetts and in Connecticut. As Chairman of the Board of Education Mr. House sponsored our school building plans which have been endorsed by a large body of the people. A Republican party leader Senator House has followed the party line and has voted against the school building aid.

In any event Manchester, the state and the nation have an exceptionally large crop of youngsters to educate. We do not have the money to do so. If we all take a more active interest perhaps we can find a way to do so. Education out of the realm of party politics is a necessity. It certainly does not belong.

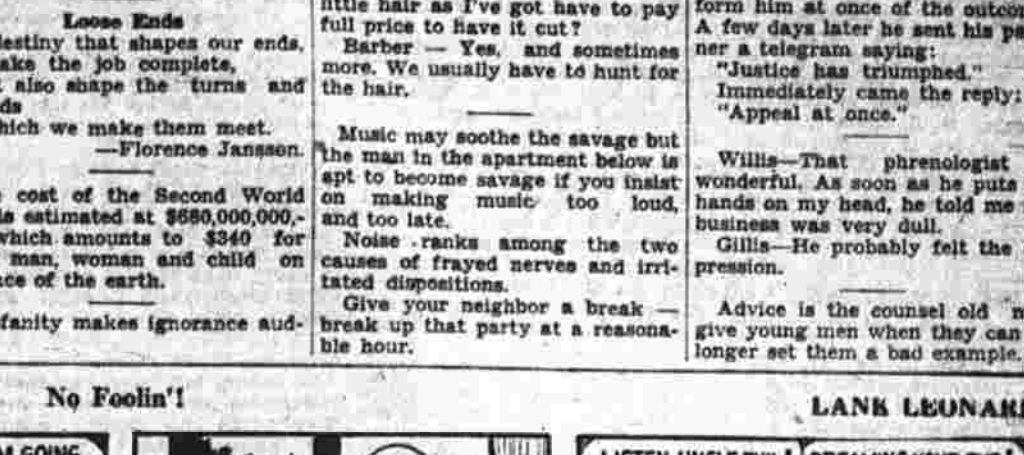
