Basseter, Ala., July 14.—Four thousand coal miners were on strike today, apparently in protest of 10 arrests that followed a mine employer's complaint of being beaten.

Thomas A. Warnell, 30, told sheriff's deputies he was beaten and killed by a mob of 60 men Friday night for not observing a three-day work week.

He is employed in a maintenance job at the Short Creek mine of Tennessee Coal, Iron & Railroad Co.

W. Pitt Job Not Affected

Warnell is a member of the United Mine Workers Short Creek local union. The UMW has ordered a three-day work week and has said his job was not affected by the order.

The men have been arrested on warrants of assault with intent to murder sworn out by Warnell. He identified all the men as members of the Short Creek UMW local.

Short Creek and five other UMW mines were idle yesterday. All have been working only on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday under the UMW's three-day work week.

A company spokesman said the work stoppage was a protest against the arrests in the Warnell case. The mines employ about 4,000 men.

Pope Bars All Militant Reds From Church

Non-leftist Italian papers for the first time have reported that the pope has barred all militant communists from the church.

The Vatican order, which was announced in a decree issued last night, is the first of its kind since the end of the second world war.

The pope's decree is a direct result of the Vatican's long-standing policy of opposing communism. It is a significant step in the Vatican's effort to purify the church of any influence from the left.

The decree states that any priest or layman who is a member of a communist party or who is active in communist activities is automatically excluded from the church. This includes those who are members of the Italian Communist Party, the French Communist Party, and other communist organizations.

Thus, if a six-year-old child has a mental age of three, the intelligence quotient would be 50. If, on the other hand, a child of six has an intelligence quotient of 150, the intelligence testing would be 150.

Some harm has probably been done by this idea of intelligence testing, as parents are often inclined to pay too much attention to the results, especially when they are above the average.

However, children who have been given adequate attention to their education and training can do very well in school.

Parents often feel a keen sense of responsibility for the handicap of a retarded child. Repeated drill or training cannot do away with the mental handicap. It is not possible by training to raise a youngster's IQ from 70 to 100.

The true ideal, at the bottom of the intelligence scale, will always require institutional care and cannot be educated in school subjects.

The next lowest class, or imbecile group, can do somewhat better and perform simple household tasks, like dusting, but cannot be well educated in school subjects.

Above these two lower groups are the less seriously retarded children, who under favorable conditions can be taught how to support themselves in simple occupations but who do not go far in the school work, usually not beyond the elementary grades.

Psychiatrists and school administrative officers can help parents to decide how much the retarded child might reasonably be expected to learn, and the best possible program can then be worked out.

Must Put Negroes On Jury Duty List

Atlanta, July 14—(AP)—Georgia counties with heavy Negro populations must place Negroes on jury lists, the state Supreme court ruled.

Raising its opinion on decisions of other states and the U. S. Supreme court, the Georgia court yesterday declared:

"Whatever may be the opinion of the members of this court as to the correctness, soundness or wisdom of these decisions, it becomes our duty to yield thereto."

"This being a government by law and not by men, jury composition is in their official conduct are bound by the foregoing rulings... notwithstanding any personal opinions, hereditary instincts, natural impulses or geographical conditions to the contrary."

The ruling came on an appeal of a Negro, John Crumb, convicted by an all-white jury of pointing a pistol at another. The high court ordered a new trial because Negroes were barred from the jury panel.

It Will Come

For its inevitable penetration of the crisis, in thought and feeling that is the most basic and serious of all modern day problems, the book delivered by Dr. Robert Hutchins, chancellor of the University of Chicago, at the Gothic Biennial Convention, out in the open, is one of the most notable public utterances of our time.

What Dr. Hutchins did was to confront the terrible fact that the more leisure our civilization creates for itself, the less purposeful, the more trivial and empty it becomes.

Our technology, he said, solves more and more problems, and gives us more and more time. And the more time we have, the more we behave as if the goal of our civilization were one huge "coney island."

"There is no military way," Dr. Hutchins continued, in his truth-weighted irony, "by which we can avoid being blown to bits. There is no mechanical way by which we can hope to avoid being blown to death. Since there is no defense against the atomic bomb, that is the only way to avoid being blown to bits."

What is the answer? Here Dr. Hutchins becomes almost positive in contrast to the ironic penetration of his analysis. Only a "moral, intellectual and spiritual revolution" can turn our civilization from its downward course.
