Open Forum
 To the editor:
 Having returned from a week's scholarship at Mount Holyoke, I am glad to express my admiration not only in the idea itself, of holding public courses during the summer months, but also in the organization which enables its audience in a short time to become acquainted and familiar with most of the important questions of our foreign policy especially those in conformity with the principles of the United Nations.
 Every day during the four week period, there are lectures given by prominent personalities in the educational and political fields. The lectures are conducted in a most interesting and instructive manner by distinguished scholars. There are also educational films shown and other arrangements. Every week there is an over-night trip to Lake Success, N. Y., to attend one of the sessions of the councils of the United Nations and to observe the proceedings, but also to acquire a knowledge of the important and interesting work of the United Nations, and to observe the achievement of a lasting peace.
 The program of this year's affair is most interesting and enlightening. "How Can We The People Achieve A Just Peace" contains four very important subjects: Human Rights and Individual Liberty; The Problem of European Unity; Conflicts and Tensions in Asia; and The Outlook for World Stability.
 Among the many distinguished and famous speakers of this year's affair are: Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, Chairman of the United States Commission on Human Rights; Philip H. 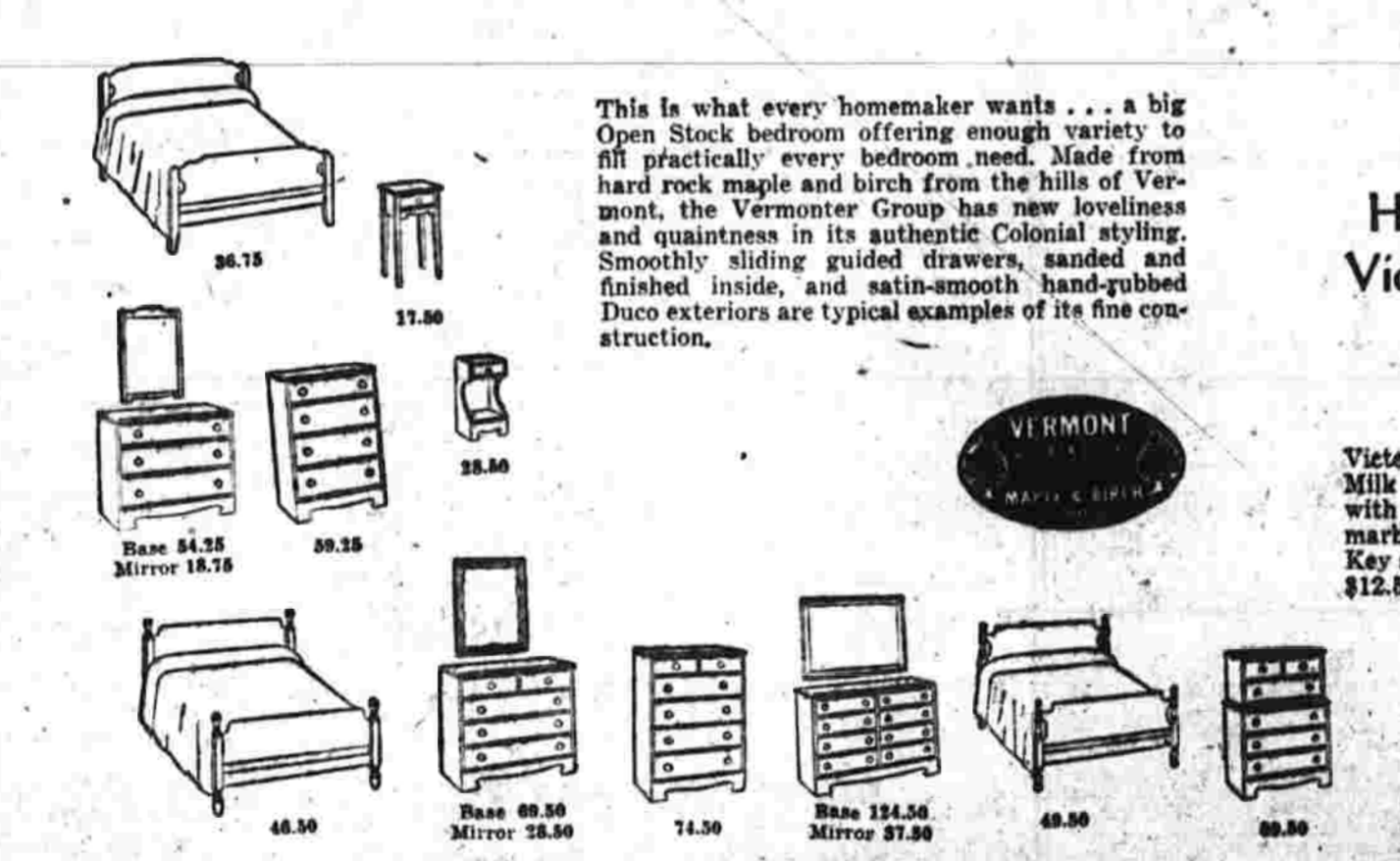
