Tobacco Loss Seen Greater

Damage in Storms Revised Upward to \$3,000,000 Today

Hartford, July 21.—(AP)—Daylight on farms battered by Wednesday's wind and hail storm today revised upward the tobacco damage to \$3,000,000—climax of the most disastrous year to Hartford county general crops in a quarter-century.

Before the storm the damage to general crops from 35 days of scouring drought in the county was put by County Farm Agent William L. Harris, Jr. at \$1,000,000.

Total agricultural loss this year is the greatest in Hartford 22 years in office, he said.

In hardest hit sections such as Ellington, Broad Brook and Windsor, the storm today had left a scene of destruction in tobacco fields. Plants were buck full of holes by hail like a shotgun target, lay tattered in the mud, and bits of balloons or rymolone on some tobacco tents at daylight.

But the picture was optimistic. Farmers on the west side of the Connecticut river escaped damage to the extent of the rain was not enough to break the drought. Precipitation at Hartford was 2.4 inches, soaking down into the ground more than a foot in places.

Estimate Revised Upward

After surveying one-quarter of the affected area Ralph C. Laury, Jr. of the Rhode Tobacco Co. association said the damage on the basis he revised upward the damage estimate to \$3,000,000. The Silverberg plantation, Ellington, reported the tobacco cloth destroyed on 15 of 20 acres and 25 percent total crop damage.

But at the same time County Agent Harris said damage to shade and broadleaf tobacco was relatively small in other areas he toured from Ellington through East Hartford to South Windsor.

25 growers report losses in the range of \$100 to \$500. Many of them had all spilled last spring for Federal crop insurance coverage. Most are in the Broad Brook area. One fourth of them said their tobacco was damaged beyond repair.

"A 'big save' was the term used by Associate County Farm Agent Russell S. Anderson, describing the overall rain.

"A few crops were beyond repair as a result of the drought, but for the most part it gave farms a new lease on life," Anderson said.

Fertilizer Beaten Into Ground

The county agent said that because of the drought, fertilizer had lain on top of the ground since late spring. The storm beat it down into the soil, with the result, Anderson said, that the crops will "soak up" the fertilizer.

A different picture came from almost every area. Some had enough rain with no damage. "It was just what we needed," said Henry Schenck on one of the Hartford tobacco company plantations, Bloomfield.

Windsor Local reported insufficient rainfall to break the drought.

Later yesterday in an endorsement of the McMahon report, the Senate the Atomic pact will carry no obligation for this country to share its atomic know-how.

McMahon tried hard to brush off any discussion of the atomic matter during the Senate past debate.

At the present time, because of the fact that we are engaged in international relations with two of our allies with regard to this subject, I do not feel I care to pursue the matter any further," he told the Senate.

Give Secret Statement

Three countries, he noted, are now cooperating in a limited way on atomic matters, as well as on the all-important question of raw materials supply.

During World War II there was close cooperation between the three allies in the development of the atomic weapon in this country. This was stopped only by the atomic energy act of 1946.

In the meantime, the United States has gone ahead to develop new designs of bombs and new methods of production on its own, but with uranium largely controlled by Britain and Canada.

Rockville Coaster Derby To Be Feature

Annual Event to Be Held in Rockville on August 20th

Rockville, July 21.—(Special)—The annual "Coaster Derby" sponsored by the Recreation Board, will be run over the American Mill Hill course on Saturday afternoon, August 20 starting at 2 p. m. This has been one of the outstanding features of the Recreation Program for the past several years and it is to be hoped that this year will again prove successful with a goodly number of entries.

The following rules will apply: Age—fifteen years and under. Car—No ball bearing wheels, no pneumatic tires, width, not over 42 inches, length, not over 30 inches. Wheel tread, not less than 26 inches and not more than 28 inches; wheel base, not less than 18 inches; wheels, not larger than 15 inches; weight, not over 200 lbs. including driver, no added weight for ballast; each car must be equipped with either drag brakes or wheel brakes. Car must be of rigid and safe construction, subject to inspection before entry can be accepted.

Last year seventeen boys entered their "Coasters" and the committee hopes this year that the number will be increased. The more entries, the better the program. There is plenty of time available for the building of the cars and a deadline for the acceptance of entries will be set and announced later in the papers. Without entries there will be no "Derby". Entries will be accepted by the two local newspapers and members of the Recreation Board. Boys wishing to enter are urged to get their names in as soon as possible as making the "Coaster Derby" is a successful event.

There will be Union services on Sunday at the Rockville Methodist church at 10:45 a. m. The pastor, Rev. Albert W. Jackson preaching. He will have the sermon topic "The Narrow Way".

Germ Disposal Plant Sought

Bacterial Waste from Army Laboratory Is Dangerous to Area

Washington, July 21.—(AP)—The military's bacteriological waste disposal plant is faced with the same problem confronting the atomic material factories—disposal of highly dangerous waste products. This came to light today in an Army report discussing new details on the operation of the Germ Warfare Research project at Camp Detrick, Md. That is where the Army started the bacterial warfare project during World War II and the laboratory currently is the only one operated by the military.

Waste Must Be Sterilized "Both the sewage which is extremely virulent and the air which comes in contact with it must be sterilized to prevent contamination of operating personnel at Camp Detrick, and of citizens and property of the adjacent community," the Army states. (The camp is on the outskirts of Frederick, Md.) In asking for \$400,000 to build new decontamination facilities at Camp Detrick, the Army said that present equipment is wholly inadequate for the expanded research and development program.

This was the first official indication of intention to augment the bacterial warfare studies. The Army has asked Congress for \$3,315,000 for new facilities and construction at Camp Detrick. Outside of a \$200,000 item for housing the money is to be used for improving both offensive and defensive aspects of war with biological weapons. These weapons are for use against both men and his food sources—plants and animals. Plans Research Construction The military includes among its plans construction of a new building for "aero-biological research." In this project, the "BW" experts are seeking to find how effective the spreading of bacteria can be when released from an airborne carrier. The report speaks cryptically of studies of "aerosol clouds." This is presumed to refer to a cloud of bacteria which is fairly cohesive and will not be dispersed by normal wind action or the naturally purifying action of sunlight.

Woman Asked To Go on Air

Witness Says Allied Prisoners Wanted Tokyo Rose to Take Part

San Francisco, July 21.—(AP)—Three Allied prisoners in Japan asked to have Tokyo Rose participate in wartime radio broadcasts on which they worked, a government witness in her treason trial conceded. But the witness, George Mitchell, also corroborated yesterday earlier testimony on seven of the eight overt acts of treason of which the government accuses the defendant, Mrs. Iva Toguri D'Aquino.

Names Prisoners Defense Attorney Wayne Collins drew from MITSUBISHI the admission that Allied prisoners sought Tokyo Rose's participation in the broadcasts. Mitsuhashi, a wartime official of Radio Tokyo, named the prisoners as Maj. Charles Cousins of Australia, Maj. Wallace Fox of the United States and Lt. Norman Reyes of the Philippines.

The defense has sought repeatedly to prove that Allied prisoners were compelled to work for Radio Tokyo; and that while ostensibly broadcasting propaganda aimed at damaging Allied troops morale, they actually slipped through reassuring messages to the front back home. Collins was to continue cross-examination of Mitsuhashi today.

Amateur Radio Plan Opposed

League's West Hartford Office Protests Government Control

West Hartford, July 21.—Vigorous opposition to a proposal of the Federal Communications Commission for Government planning and direction of the future activities of 75,000 American amateur radio operators is the basis of a brief filed today with the Commission by the American Radio Relay League.

In its filing, the League charges that application of the proposed new philosophy of Government planning will operate to stifle amateur development and eventually result in the debilitation of amateur radio as it exists today. The brief is in response to an invitation by FCC for comment from interested parties before July 30 on the Commission's extensive proposals released April 21.

"Cannot Be Disputed" The League maintains that the brilliant history of development of times in the past has been the result of free enterprise by Government of free enterprise by Government cannot be successfully planned or directed or monopolized by Government or anyone else. In the League's opinion, the replacement of free enterprise by Government direction in a field where success depends largely on personal interest and voluntary enthusiasm, would "discourage the very things which have made American amateur radio great."

The position of the League with respect to the Commission's proposals was established at the annual meeting of its Board of Directors on May 27-28. Its Board representatives nominated and elected by the amateur membership from 15 divisions into which the country is parceled for administrative purposes.

It would not be in the national interest to alter the present course of development of a volunteer radio service which has many times furnished vital emergency communication in time of disaster and is a reservoir of trained operators and technicians which the country may draw in peace or in war, the League contends. Rather, it is argued, the philosophy of the Commission toward the amateur service should remain substantially as it has in the past. That is, that the Commission need be concerned fundamentally only with providing sufficient regulations to prevent an amateur station from interfering with other established communication services, and to ensure compliance with the provisions for amateurs in international regulations to which the United States is a party. The League believes the necessary regulations governing the activity of amateurs within their own bands should come only upon request of the amateur body itself, and the attainment of amateur status should be an informal matter of record in connection with the attainment of amateur status.

Praise Given Burned Boy

Little Melvin Hill 'Over Worst' of Series of Skin Grafting Jobs

Philadelphia, July 21.—(AP)—Little Melvin Hill "is over the worst" of a series of skin grafting operations to repair the damage caused by a blast of baroness last Dec. 9.

That was the good word today from the five-year-old boy's doctor, Hans May, who says of his patient: "He's one of the nicest little boys I've ever seen."

That Degree Burns Melvin, one of 10 children of Mr. and Mrs. Martin Hill of Flemington, Pa., suffered third degree burns from his waist down as he posed a baroness-covered abraded into a furnace.

He spent four months in Lock Haven hospital before he was brought to Lankenau hospital in Philadelphia last April for a long series of skin grafting operations. "He was just a ghost of a little boy when he came," Dr. May related. Dr. May said he used skin from the child's own back for the first operations to cover both ankles, legs and part of his thighs. "Then I ran out of skin," the doctor explained. To add to the dilemma, part of the area from which the good skin was taken failed to heal because of Melvin's condition. Decided to Use Another's Skin Dr. May said in desperation he decided to use the skin of another person, though such grafts, he emphasized do not always take permanently except with identical twins.

Cites Disaster Loan Program

Office for This Emergency Area Is Located at Willimantic

Willimantic, July 21.—It was announced today by Monroe Lalkic, Supervisor of the Farmers Home Administration in Connecticut that the designation of Connecticut as an "emergency area" has made it possible for his office to make so-called "disaster loans." These loans can be made for the purchase of feed, seed, fertilizer, livestock, equipment, water and irrigation systems as well as for, in extreme cases, the refinancing of debts which can be definitely established as a result of the drought, he said.

He particularly emphasized that those loans are neither grants or compensation for losses suffered but are rather long term loans designed to help absorb the immediate shock. Lalkic explained loans involving chaffed goods can, if necessary, be written for a ten year period as compared to loans scheduled for payment over a twenty year period. All disaster loans are written at 3 per cent interest.

Lalkic stated that his office at 22 Bank Street, Willimantic, Conn., will be in a position to start accepting applications today. Temporarily this will be the only place where applications can be handled but the Supervisor said he hopes arrangements can be made so that applications can be handled in other sections of the state in order that it will be more convenient for interested to obtain this sort of help if they need it. It is impossible for Mr. Lalkic to estimate the volume of loan applications his office will receive but he said he was assured by officials of his organization that sufficient funds would be allocated from the \$44,000,000 revolving fund to meet all requirements.

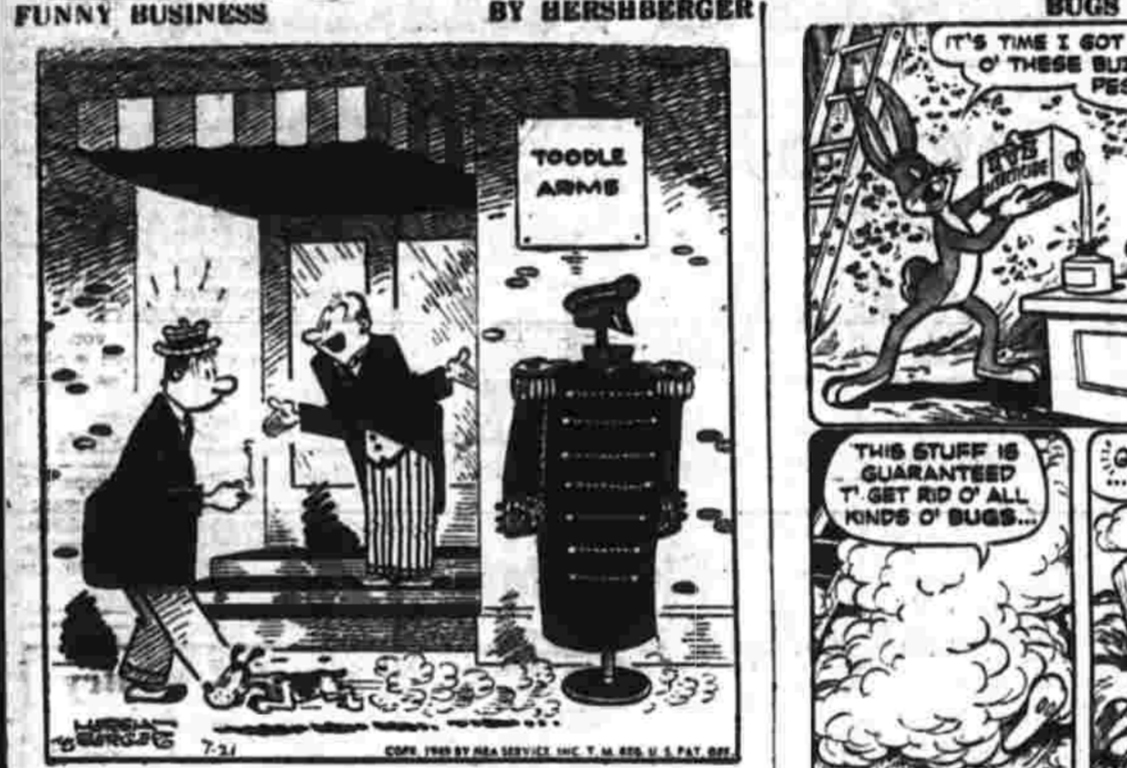
