

/ HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO DEVELOP A **NEW JET ENGINE?**



Any new aircraft engine must go through 3 basic stages before it is a proved product ready to be put into quantity production. The original design and construction of an experimental model takes 2 to 3 years. Then comes another 2 to 3-year period of development and small-quantity production to prove its performance and establish production techniques. Finally another 2 to 3 years is required for testing, refinement, and tooling up for quantity production. So each new engine model takes from 6 to 10 years to get into production, and 30 to 40 million dollars will have been risked in its development.

WHAT IS THE FUTURE OF THE PROPELLER?



Several years ago, when jet aircraft engines first appeared, many people (including some experts) predicted that they would soon replace the piston types, and that propellers would therefore disappear from aircraft. The management of our Hamilton Standard division had a tough decision to make — should it continue the further development of propellers, or seek some other field of activity? Careful study led us to the conclusion that the propeller was here to stay — both in the conventional piston-engined airplanes and in future types using turbine-propeller power plants. On this conclusion Hamilton Standard gambled, and continued to risk money in propeller development. One of the most important steps in the development of a new sirers engine is the testing of its various component parts. These tests help us determine how well the component parts will function in the finished engine, under varying conditions of temperature, altitude and load. WHAT NEW TYPES OF PROPELLERS ARE WE **WORKING ON?**



Hamilton Standard is developing an entirely new series of propellers especially designed for use with gas turbine engines. The first of these has successfully passed the official government type test. Nearly a million dollars and four years have been spent on its development to date, but it still must go through extended periods of service testing and refinement before it is ready for production.

In addition, we are well along in the development of a new counter-rotating propeller for use with future turbine-propeller engines of ex-tremely high horsepower, but it will be at least two years before it can be available in quantities.
