\$2,500 Claim Settled Here

Probate Court Approves Accord; Background Of Case Involved
 A settlement of \$2,500 was approved in Probate Court here today after a hearing in the case of a disputed claim of the Stanley Noren estate was held by Judge John J. Wallcut, Judge M. After lengthy negotiation, however, the settlement offer was made and has now been approved by Judge Wallcut.

 The job of setting up Manchester's new parking meters in the Main street shopping area was started this morning by workmen of the manufacturer, the meter division of the American LaFrance Pumps corporation.
 The meters, which receive either ten or fifteen cents for 15 minutes or an hour, are "two" type meters, designed to be placed between two parking spaces for use of the cars in either space. They will be set back 18 inches from the curb, to allow for car bumper overhang, and will stand from 52 to 54 inches in height. Claims Russians Have Exploded Atom Bomb

Paris, July 25.—(AP)—A Paris weekly newspaper claims in its current edition that Russia has exploded an atom bomb.
 The story appeared in Samedi Soir, a weekly noted for sensationalism.
 According to the newspaper, United States recording devices showed an atomic explosion in Siberia July 16.
 This, said Samedi Soir, is the reason President Truman called a top-secret conference on military scientific and congressional leaders.
 "The United States," said the weekly, "which had managed until now to keep monopoly of the atom bomb and of the material necessary for its production is in a frightful state of shock. It is known that the U. S. S. R. had pierced the secret of the bomb."
 Samedi Soir said the United States established a listening post in the Arctic region, alerted by British intelligence who had received reports from Russian refugees that the Soviets were on the point of unveiling the secret of the atom bomb.

The treaty, which would allow the United States to station troops in Portugal, was introduced by the government last night. The premier said that Russia's military strength is increasing and that she is preparing to attack the British channel and the Pyrenees. He also said that Russia is planning to attack the Mediterranean coast and the Atlantic Ocean. He urged the government to take action to protect the country against these threats.**

Supreme Court Heats Arguments on Judges

Lawyers for Democrats and Republicans Present Differing Stories in Test Cases

Hartford, July 26.—It was in the Connecticut Supreme court today to decide whether Republicans or Democrats shall determine whether the state's 68 municipal courts.

Attorney William H. Gordon Jr. testified that it was an "imperative" for Alcorn to suggest that there was "improper motives" behind Governor Bowles' action.

Colchester, July 26.—A 33-year-old Naugatuck priest brought four screaming boys from his parish to this town on an outing yesterday when he was accidentally killed by a shotgun held by one of his guests.

The victim was the Rev. John F. Waniak who had been curate of St. Hedwig's church in the Union City section of Naugatuck since his ordination at St. Joseph's cathedral, Hartford, May 18, 1941.

He was killed, Deputy Coroner Charles Cassidy said, when a shotgun discharged while being loaded by Edmund Kobylewski, one of four Union City boys who accompanied Father Waniak to a cabin which the priest owned near the Colchester-Naugatuck highway.

An investigation conducted by Constable Edward J. Sheehan and several state police under Capt. Leo Mulcahy established that the shooting was accidental.

The priest was standing nearby when the accident occurred. There were two shotguns in the party, Cassidy reported. The boys had intended to hunt turtles in Sherman brook, which runs near the Catholic center.

He identified the other boys, all witnesses to the tragedy, as Raymond J. Polakowski, 12, of Naugatuck; Richard J. Kelly, 12, of Naugatuck; and Edward J. Kelly, 12, of Naugatuck.
